Family searches for missing 19-year-old woman in Montgomery County

MONTGOMERY COUNTY, Texas – A family is searching for their missing daughter who disappeared after a date, police said. Darrell Beaty said he is in pain while he searches for his daughter.

"I don't know where she's at. I don't know what's going on," Beaty said.

Donna Cloud, 19, went missing Tuesday after going on a date with someone she met online.

"We had gotten her a phone from Walmart and she was conversing with somebody on the Internet and then she told us she was going on a date," Beaty said.

Beaty said he knows the date was at Texas Roadhouse on Highway 59 in Kingwood.

The family said they didn't know who Cloud had agreed to meet.

"She just had been messaging. He offered to take her to the roadhouse for dinner," said Cloud's stepmother, Linda Hornback.

Wednesday was the last time Beaty texted with his daughter. Donna sent a message via text stating:

"Hey, dad, I'm probably going to the mall and see a movie this weekend, not sure yet."

Since then, he's searched phone records, Facebook and still has found no sign of her.

"I don't know where she's at. She could be anywhere and it really hurts me. There's nothing I can do. I feel so helpless," Beaty said. Beaty said his daughter is a mother herself and has a 3-year-old son.

"She's 19. Just a baby," Beaty said. Beaty said they have hope for her return and praying she's safe. "We miss you and we love you and we want you to come home," Beaty said.

A Texas woman went on a date a week ago, contacted someone the next night, then vanished.

Now, investigators in Montgomery County are searching for 19-year-old Donna Kay Cloud.

The sheriff's office said Cloud, of Splendora, hasn't been seen or heard from by her family since Oct. 26. That's the night after she went on a date with a man, whose identity isn't known. Deputies believe she may have met the man online.

Investigators believe the two may have gone to the Texas Roadhouse in the Kingwood area, but aren't sure.

Montgomery County Sheriff's spokesman Brady Fitzgerald said Monday morning that deputies have followed up on several leads.

"The case is currently an active case," Fitzgerald said.

Cloud is described as standing between 5-feet tall and 5-feet, 2-inches tall and weighing about 119 pounds. She's got brown hair and black or brown eyes and small tattoos on two fingers on her left hand.

Cloud also has tattoos on her right forearm - the word "Faith" - and a tattoo across her right collar bone that says "Love Is Enough."

Multiple Facebook pages put up by family and friends of Cloud are asking people to report any sighting to the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office.

Still no answers in case of missing Splendora woman

The mystery into the disappearance of a Splendora woman deepens with each passing day. Donna Kay Cloud, 19, was last seen by her family on Tuesday, Oct. 25, and the last contact anyone had with her was on the following day.

Several sightings of a woman matching Cloud's description have been reported in the Cleveland area, but they are unconfirmed and the missing person case remains open.

Last week a rumor began circulating social media sites suggesting that Cloud had been recovered, but that is not the case, according to Lt. Brady Fitzgerald, spokesperson for the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office.

"We are still pursuing leads and our deputies are actively searching for her," Fitzgerald said.

The circumstances around Cloud's disappearance have led to a lot of finger-pointing, mostly on social media and particularly at her father, Darrell Beaty, who claims he was criticized for setting up an online Go Fund Me account to help with the search efforts.

"People began saying it was a scam for money. I could not care less about that. I just want my daughter to come home," Beaty said. "I don't want the money. I don't want a single dime of it. I just want people to know she is still missing."

Initially it was reported that Cloud had disappeared after going on a blind date with a man from Liberty, and the two had planned to go to the Texas Roadhouse restaurant in Kingwood. However, according to her father, the surveillance video does not show Cloud at the restaurant.

"I don't know what kind of people she got mixed up with. There have been a lot of things that appear to have been done to throw things off the track and cause confusion," Beaty said. "When I heard she had been seen with a male friend in the Cleveland area and no foul play was involved, I was relieved to know she was okay. It took me a few hours to even believe she was okay. I was so hurt she would do this."

But as time wore on, Beaty learned that the sightings of his daughter were unconfirmed and no one had actually spoken to her.

"I am concerned that people might spot her on the road and say, 'Oh, she has already been found' and not report it, or quit looking for her altogether," he said. "I realize she is an adult. She's 19 years old and can't be considered a runaway, but she is still missing."

Shane Stewart, a Houston-based private investigator, was among a group of volunteers who tried to help law enforcement early in the investigation by passing on information. Stewart said he has since backed away from the case because of inconsistent information from the family and his concern that her disappearance is being used for financial gain.

Stewart says that Cloud's case has been "so ridiculous that I want zero involvement in any other missing adult case in the future."

He believes that a heated argument between Cloud and Beaty through text messages prompted her to leave.

"Some people claim she is doing this to hurt her father but she is hurting everyone if she is still out there," Stewart said. "Do I believe she is alive? Yes. Do I believe she is in danger? No, but I hope I don't have to eat my words later."

Stewart said the alleged sightings of Cloud in the Cleveland area placed her with an unknown white male in a red, four-door car, but again, these are unconfirmed.

Cloud is described as a white female, between 5' 1" and 5' 5", weighing 95-110 pounds. She has dark hair and dark brown eyes. Some of her distinguishing characteristics are deep dimples on both cheeks and a nose piercing. She has a tattoo on her right forearm with the word "Faith," a cross tattoo on the index finger on her right hand and a tattoo that says "Love is Enough" on her right collarbone.

Hello, my name is Darrell Beaty, I am the father of 19 year old Donna Kay Cloud of Splendora, Texas. Donna Cloud is a missing person and has not been seen by loved ones since October 25, 2016. Donna has not been heard from or seen in more than 26 days.

Despite many rumors that she was located and safe, Donna is still very much missing. I am extremely concerned about her safety, and well being.

We are pleading with the public, Local Law Enforcement, and media outlets to help aide us in finding her. We ask anyone with information to please come forward, and contact Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. Somewhere someone has the missing pieces of information to find her. Anyone who has seen or spoke to Donna around Oct 26th we are pleading with you to come forward no matter how small the information it could be the link we need.

This has been a parent's worst nightmare, and we are living it daily. We have been on such a emotional roller coaster, that began on the first day and continues on a daily basis. There is a unbearable amount of pain, worry and anguish that comes with something like this, and it stays with you every moment of everyday. The worst part, is not knowing if your child is safe or not.

Additionally, I was cruelly slandered, and criticized by cyber bullie's on social media for these cry's for help. It is no secret, that my vehicle was in need of repairs at the time Donna went missing. I also being the sole provider for my family had to take many days off of work to search

for her as well as track her last known movements. Therefore a Gofundme account was put in place asking for help. Rumors and slander became so numerous that Gofundme was contacted and as a result there was a hold placed on all funds while a fraud investigation was conducted. I have since been cleared of any wrong doing, and all funds have since been released back into the account. However, due to the accusations and cruel rumors, I decided not to used one dime of the \$390.00 that was raised.. I never desired to profit from Donna's disappearance, and I would give all my worldly possession's just to have her home safe. I only want to find my daughter and am desperate for help.

Because of the unfolding events associated with GoFundMe, and the misleading information we received about Donna being found safe, all the help we had pulled out. Additionally my name was drug through the mud and our credibility was severely damaged. I never could have dreamed someone we trusted would base their findings on mere assumption's that she was located safe. For several days we believed Donna was safe and were waiting patiently to see her. Personally it took me over 4 hours to believe this was the truth before I posted about it on Face Book. On the following Monday we heard from the Sheriff 's Office that all the info we were given about her being safe were cruel assumptions and simply was not a true fact. None of the information given to us was verified by anyone in any way shape or form. We were then left single handedly searching for our daughter as well as trying to correct all the damage that had been done.

I can only pray that the critical time period for finding Donna has not lapsed already, and I wanted everyone to know the truth in its entirety. We were simply mislead and this is were most of the public confusion came into play. We were judged and we were slandered and as a parent we had not been in these circumstance before. We did not know where to turn or what to do. There is not a manual that one can turn to for step by step guidance to locate a missing loved one. We excepted help from areas we felt were trustworthy but later came to regret this decision.

I pray that we as a community can set aside personal opinion and difference and unite together as one in effort to bring my daughter home. What happened to a 19-year-old mom? Family desperate for answers after her disappearance

KINGWOOD, TX (KTRK) -- A young mother seemingly vanished following a blind date, according to her family. Donna Kay Cloud is now considered a missing person. Cloud, 19, has been missing since Oct. 27, 2016. She is a mother to a 4-year-old son named Ryan.

Her father Darrell Beaty and grandmother Donna Brock want answers about her disappearance. They said Cloud claimed she had connected with a man on Facebook through mutual friends. According to the family, both agreed to go on a date at the Texas Roadhouse in Kingwood on Oct. 25. She hasn't been seen in person since that evening.

"She said she would be over on the 27th between 11 and 11:30 for us to meet this guy. Well, that was the last communication we had with her. Today makes 71 days that no one has heard from her that we know of," said Brock. "I know someone out there knows where she is. I mean, people do not vanish."

Beaty said Brock texted him the next day. In messages shared with Eyewitness News, Donna writes, "I will see you in the morning the date went great he's super nice I will call if I need anything."

"If someone does have her. If someone is holding her against her will, let her go," said Beaty. "I can promise you. I'm not going to give up looking for her and I'm not going to stop. I'm going to follow every lead."

The Montgomery County Sheriff's Office told ABC13 that Cloud is considered a missing person. Investigators said she and her family had some type of disagreement prior to her disappearance. They said they are concerned about the case and multiple detectives are assigned to it. They said Donna had no cell phone to trace for a location or credit cards and that she is known to hang out with an unsavory crowd.

Detectives said there is no evidence at this moment to suggest foul play or to support the notion Donna met up for a blind date.

The twitter account @BringDonnaHome is being used to spread awareness about the case on social media.

Missing Splendora woman's father says unsolved case is 'tearing my life apart'

Seven months have passed since the disappearance of Donna Kay Cloud, 19, of Splendora. Authorities say they have exhausted their leads but are continuing to follow new information as it is reported.

"We are doing everything we can," said Lt. Scott Spencer, spokesperson for the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. "We have no new information and have nothing to suggest she has been harmed. The detective has checked into every aspect of the case but has had no luck."

Cloud was last seen by her family on Oct. 25, 2016. Several sightings of a woman matching Cloud's description have been reported to authorities but to no avail.

Initially it was reported that Cloud had gone on a date with an unknown male; however, law enforcement has been unable to corroborate that claim.

Her father, Darrel Beaty, in previous interviews with the Advocate, says his daughter told him she was meeting the man at a restaurant in Kingwood. Detectives checked the surveillance video from the restaurant but found no signs of Cloud.

With each passing day, Beaty's hope for a good outcome erodes.

"I am starting to believe she is not out there, that she is not okay," he said. "Part of me just wants to find her, just to get closure. I know it's only been seven months but it's tearing my life apart."

Beaty says he is angry and feels that not enough is being done to find his daughter.

"I have written both of our U.S. senators from Texas and the governor and asked that they form a missing person task force. People who have missing persons in their family get the same response from law enforcement that I am getting," Beaty said. "They (the agencies) don't have the resources to devote enough time to missing person cases. They get handed over to detectives who are overloaded with violent crime cases and other things take priority."

While that might be the case with other agencies, Spencer said it is not an accurate opinion of the sheriff's office.

"The detective who is working the case is in constant communication with her grandmother. Some of the family members have hurt our investigation more than they have helped. They logged into her social media accounts that we could have used to develop leads," Spencer said. "We get that they are frustrated. We get that they are upset but we are doing everything we can to find her."

According to Spencer, the sheriff's office is still considering the possibility that she might have voluntarily walked away from her family, a claim her father vehemently denies.

Beaty admits the two had a strained relationship but says she would not have disappeared without a word to him or the grandmother who raised her.

"She wouldn't just disappear. Donna was free to come and go from my home. She is not a runaway," he said.

Cloud is described as a white female, 5' 1", weighing 120 pounds. She has dark hair and dark brown eyes.

Some of her distinguishing characteristics are deep dimples on both cheeks and a piercing in her right nostril. She has a tattoo on her right forearm with the word "Faith," a cross tattoo on the middle finger of her right hand, a diamond tattoo on her right ring finger, and a tattoo that says "Love is Enough" on her right collarbone.

NEW CANEY, Texas (KTRK) -- Donna Kay Cloud's disappearance makes no sense. Her loved ones remain desperate for answers.

The teenager and mother of a little boy went missing in late October 2016. Donna told the family she was headed on a blind date at Kingwood restaurant.

They haven't seen or heard from her in all that time.

Family and friends have spent the past months raising money to increase her Crime Stoppers reward money. It's currently valued at \$1,000. You can reach Crime Stoppers at 1-800-392-7867.

They hope cash might help spur information and ultimately break Donna's case.

"People are greedy. If they do know something, maybe if we can get that up, then we can get someone to come forward and tell us where she is," said her grandmother Donna Brock. "Someone knows something. Someone doesn't just vanish without a trace."

Yesterday, they held a bake sale and raffle outside the Academy store in New Caney. Someone stole the raffle jar with hundreds of dollars in it.

Family friend Randi Strickland said her son saw the man responsible. She said the thief taunted her store earlier inside the Academy.

"Literally I turned around for a second and my son was screaming that they took the money," said Strickland. "He had followed my child around, talking about what we were doing was pointless because we were going to find her dead anyway."

Donna's grandfather, Alex Brock, said he believes in his heart she is being held against will.


"I'm looking for my grandbaby. She means the world to me. I need her here with me," Alex said.
"I believe that she's out there somewhere and she's just waiting on someone to rescue her."


