Starting At the start of the game you will be split into two groups, bachelors and bachelorettes, on a tv show this will most likely be men and women, however if its an uneven ratio between male and female just split them all up.

Immunity The first challenge is an immunity challenge for the larger group, if teams are even it doesn't matter which group. For this example we will say the boy group are all competing for individual immunity. This winning player is safe from the rose ceremony.

Ineligibility Is for the other group, in this case the girls. The winner of the challenge chooses two people from her own group who can't give someone a rose, she may pick herself. She will be the first to give someone a rose at the ceremony (*Assuming she doesn't pick herself to be ineligible*) and will decide the remaining order. The same person can not win ineligibility two rounds in a row, so the winner must sit out the next time their group goes for ineligibility.

Rose Ceremony Now the rose ceremony happens. Each girl will have one rose to give to a boy. The stud who won the immunity will not be able to be picked. There should be one more boy than girl, excluding the one immune boy and two ineligible girls (*This process may vary between games, but this is how it will happen if teams start out even, if teams are uneven the team with one more will compete for immunity and only one person will have to not give a rose at the rose ceremony, then the next week two people need to be classed as ineligible*) so the one boy who doesn't receive a rose will be eliminated.

This process is then repeated except the roles alternate. So the boy group will now do the ineligibility challenge and give girls their roses, meanwhile the girl group will do the immunity challenge. The only difference is that the boy group will only pick one person who can't give someone a rose (*Or two if teams started uneven*). The remaining girl who wasn't handed a rose will be eliminated.

Finale When there's 4 people left (Two bachelors, two bachelorettes). The jury will vote for two winners, one from the bachelor group, another from the bachelorette group. The two winners will be crowned the bachelor and bachelorette.

Terms

Ineligible: People selected by the ineligibility winner who can't participate in the rose ceremony.

Bachelors: People associated with the bachelor side.

Bachelorettes: People associated with the bachelorette side.

Golden Rose: The player with the golden rose can choose to use it at the start of a rose ceremony and will be safe for that ceremony. They then must steal a rose from a player of their choice on the other side. This person won't be able to give someone else a rose and will be deemed ineligible.

Twists

Group Swap: Groups will be randomly shuffled.

Lovers: You will be informed of your personal bachelor/bachelorette and if you both make it to final 4 you will automatically win with each other. If two pairs of lovers make it to the final they cancel each other out and jury needs to vote.

Golden Rose: Basically the Bachelor's version of immunity idols from survivor. The host will explain how you can obtain a golden rose (challenge, game, etc). The golden rose must be played at the very start of the rose ceremony (the host should ask if anyone has one that they'd like to play). The player with the golden rose will then be safe for that ceremony and must steal a rose from a player of their choice on the other side. This person won't be able to give someone else a rose and will be deemed ineligible. They should expire at final 8, however the host may choose to change this. You may give your golden rose away to other people but you must inform the host.

Single Bachelor / Single Bachelorette: One person will be in charge of the rose ceremony, meaning they will decide who goes home each week. There will be no eligibility challenge when this twist is involved. Recommend to play with masks or alts to avoid pregame.
