Annette Walker Tap Programme - Changing Times Tap Initiative Report, May 2023

The Annette Walker Tap Programme has been able to deliver tap workshops and apprenticeships to its young adult Tap Ambassadors and students with the support of the Changing Times Tap Initiative grant.

Classes and workshops

Studio update

The *Coin Street Centre Trust* has continued to offer studio space at Colombo Centre in London, as originally organised by Jreena Green of *Jazz Dance Elite* (JDE) dance company since August 2021. Colombo Centre changed its main sports hall flooring over the summer period July-Sept 2022.

Weekly classes

The Tap Programme (TP) weekly, 2 hour, adult community tap classes resumed in Oct 2022 and ran until Dec 2022, offering a subsidised rate for JDE students and free training for Tap Ambassadors (TA).

For the block of classes from 23 Oct to 11 Dec 2023, a free after class "Tap Hang" was offered on demand and ran twice with a sharing of Annette's tap footage and in-depth discussions.

Reschedule

In January 2023, the Colombo Centre abruptly stopped all tap activities on the new floor which cancelled the weekly classes and interrupted the planned schedule of Tap Programme activities. The Coin Street Trust continued to support both JDE and TA activities. A flooring solution has been sought to resume weekly tap classes at the Colombo Centre after summer 2023. TP activities were rescheduled to be delivered with adjustments to the budget to cover costs for an alternative studio.

4 April, 14 May, 4 June, 2 July 2023



In addition to practical tap sessions that include historical context, Tap Ambassadors were offered the opportunity to accompany and assist with teaching and on professional engagements to learn about working as a tap dancer. This was particularly important in settings where there is no knowledge about the technical requirements of tap and so the dancer is also a technical tap consultant.

Teaching assistant

With the pause on the weekly Tap Programme, Tap Ambassadors were invited to assist Annette with Monday evening, absolute beginners tap course for adults at Bishopsgate Institute, a cultural centre for leisure and learning in London. Aaron has been assisting since March which has helped build his tap technique and self-confidence.

Teaching assistant collaboration with JDE

As part of an agreement for use of the Colombo Centre studio space, Jreena Green offers low-rate community classes and has engaged Aaron to assist with children's tap sessions, putting aspects of the Tap Programme into further use. Regular updates of their progress are shared with Annette.
