<b>Course Name: Music Theory/ Piano 1</b>	<b>Grade: 9-12</b>
<b>Prerequisites:</b> This a course for students with little to no music knowledge to establish a foundation of music theory and basic piano skills.	
<b>Course Description:</b> This course is designed to teach the concepts and fundamentals necessary to understand music theory through playing the piano. As such, performing on the piano is the secondary goal of this class, while the basics of music theory, such as notation, rhythm, melody and harmony are what we are primarily focused on. Students will develop the self-discipline needed for good practice habits as they prepare for class performances.
