All goats must be owned or leased by January 31, 2026.

Youth Meat Goat Doe Show

- The SRCF General Rules & Regulations apply to this show.
- Meat goats and dairy goats are in two separate shows and shall not compete against one another, nor may a goat be shown in both shows. Pygmy goats will enter meat classes and be judged by the meat standards.
- Horned Meat goats are allowed, provided they are easily controlled, behaved, and properly managed by the youth.

SHOW DAY

- Failure to have an animal under control will result in disqualification.
- Animals should be clean and have neatly trimmed hooves.
- Participation in showmanship is mandatory.

CLASSES

- The Show Coordinators reserve the right to combine or divide classes as necessary for the benefit of the overall show.
- Some classes may be divided into small groups according to the number of entries. The top 5 of these groups will be brought back to show for the Class placings.

Dairy Goat Doe Show

- All Santa Rosa County Fair General Rules apply and must be followed.
- Senior Does must have freshened to be eligible for senior classes.
- Only females of the major dairy breeds are allowed. Does may be registered or grade. Grade animals must possess characteristics of their particular dairy breed.

- Meat goats and dairy goats are in two separate shows and shall not compete against one another, nor may a goat be shown in both shows.
- Dairy goats must be dehorned or have their horns tipped.

SHOW DAY

- Failure to have an animal under control will result in disqualification.
- Animal should be clean and have neatly trimmed hooves.
- Exhibitor should know the age of the doe and her freshening date if applicable.
- Participation in showmanship is mandatory.

CLASSES

- The Show Superintendent reserve the right to combine or divide classes as necessary for the benefit of the overall show.
- Some classes may be divided into small groups according to the number of entries. The top 5 of these groups will be brought back to show for the Class placings.

Showmanship

- All Santa Rosa County Fair General Rules apply and must be followed.
- No bucks can be shown in this showmanship class.
- Meat and dairy goat does are required to show in their assigned class along with showmanship.
- Wethered goats may only be shown in showmanship. Exhibitor of a wether goat will still pay complete entry fee and complete a record book.
- Failure to have an animal under control will result in disqualification.
- Animal should be clean and hoofs trimmed.
- The Show Superintendent reserve the right to combine or divide classes as necessary for the benefit of the overall show.
