### Communication

### Expectations of Students Learning for Success

## Doing "Turtle"

If a student should feel themselves getting mad or upset, they will be encouraged to do "Turtle". The steps for doing "Turtle" are: 1. STOP (Give yourself a hug). 2. BREATHE (do 5 belly breathes) 3. SAY what the problem is and how they felt. (The problem is ... and I feel ...) There is an egg chair in the class, where a student may choose to do turtle in private, if they wish. The egg chair provides a quiet, private place for them to calm themselves down. In the egg chair there are a few calming objects as well as a visual card to remind them of the steps to do "Turtle".

### Integrated Subjects

Science, Social Studies, Health, Information and Communication Technology

A Ziploc bag containing books will go home each **Friday**. The bag and books <u>MUST</u> be returned to school the following **Thursday** so that new books can be sent home. I can **NOT** stress strongly enough how important it is that your child read for at least 15 minutes <u>EVERY</u> night. This continued practice of skills and strategies taught in class is crucial to the gains your child will make in both reading and writing.
