## Some Differences Between Private and Public Homeschooling From a Christian Perspective

Public money cannot used in any religious school and religious instruction is prohibited by the California Constitution<sup>2</sup>. Article IX, Section 8 states:

## Text of Section 8:

No public money shall ever be appropriated for the support of any sectarian or denominational school, or any school not under the exclusive control of the officers of the public schools; nor shall any sectarian or denominational doctrine be taught, or instruction thereon be permitted, directly or indirectly, in any of the common schools of this State.<sup>[1]</sup>

## This means that:

- 1. No public money can be used for the support of any Christian school
- 2. All virtual public charter school home schools are under the exclusive control of the officers of the public schools
- 3. No Christian doctrine can be taught
- 4. No Christian instruction can be given, directly or indirectly
