- Conducting Small Group Support: Organizing small group, age-appropriate social-emotional support sessions to address the specific needs of students and promote emotional resilience.
- Meeting Vulnerable Students' Needs: Ensuring that the needs of vulnerable students
 are met through tailored support and resources, aiming for long-term positive change
 and improvement in their quality of life.
- **Enhancing Parent Communication:** Communicating with parents about student care plans, and providing resources to facilitate effective parent engagement and support.

"We are thrilled to have received this grant to support our plans for a social-emotional support coach," says Amanda Kvasnicka, Community Education Director. "Mary Schumacher, with her extensive knowledge and experience, will be instrumental in assisting students with their social-emotional needs and supporting families in their child's education. While we will continue to foster academics, the emphasis on early social-emotional development is a vital aspect of this grant."

Research underscores the importance of developing emotional intelligence and resilience from a young age, as these skills are foundational for positive relationships and overall well-being.
