Climate science is being successfully delivered and integrated into conservation planning and management efforts across U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service programs within Region 1. The Pacific Region has been a leader in the development of tools and integration of climate science in regulatory processes; vulnerability assessments of species, their habitats, and other Service resources; adaptation planning; and, communication to external partners and the public. The purpose of this talk is to share examples of these efforts, make known the resources that are available to use both internally and externally, and share additional products that will be available in the near future. The continued consideration of climate science in all that we do as an agency is an integral part of achieving the Service mission. Being informed as a region of the accomplishments we have had integrating climate science across programs and the resources available to continue doing this is important to future successful conservation.
