Assignment: "Remember the Maine!" - Yellow Journalism Project

Objective:

Use the techniques of **yellow journalism** to create a newspaper article or headline that either:

- Blames Spain for the sinking of the USS Maine (pro-war)
- Argues Spain was not responsible and calls for peace (anti-war)

Background:

In February 1898, the USS Maine exploded in Havana Harbor, killing more than 260 sailors. No one knew what caused the explosion, but newspapers like *The New York Journal* and *The World* printed sensational, emotional stories blaming Spain, which pushed the U.S. closer to war.

This assignment challenges you to "be the reporter" and create a piece of yellow journalism that could have influenced the American public in 1898.

Instructions:

1. Choose Your Side:

- Pro-War: Convince readers that Spain deliberately destroyed the USS
 Maine and the U.S. must act!
- Anti-War: Argue that there's not enough proof Spain is guilty, and call for patience and diplomacy.

- 2. Create Your Piece: (PARAGRAPHS are 5-7 sentences and well structured)
 You may write one of the following (choose one):
 - Front-Page Newspaper Article (at 1-2 paragraphs)
 - Sensational Headline with Illustration (poster w/ a paragraph)
 - Editorial (persuasive opinion piece, 1-2 paragraphs)
- 3. Use Yellow Journalism Techniques:
 - o Bold, dramatic headlines (ex: "BLOOD ON SPAIN'S HANDS!")
 - o Emotional, exaggerated language
 - Images or sketches (realistic or exaggerated)
 - Appeal to readers' emotions (anger, sympathy, patriotism)

4. Include These Details:

- What happened to the USS Maine
- Who you think is responsible
- What action the United States should take next (war, peace talks, etc.)
