The problem must be clear, briefly state the main purpose of this service, and highlight the conclusion. Technical terms must be defined. Symbols, abbreviations, and acronyms should be defined the first time they are used.

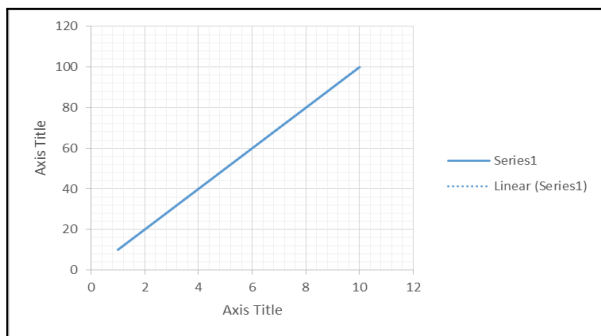


Figure 1. Image title

Without a clear conclusion, reviewers and readers will have difficulty assessing your work or whether it is suitable for publication. Don't repeat the abstract or

just list the results of your service. Give scientific considerations to your work and state possible applications and developments. You must suggest further services based on the results of your service.
