Argumentative Research Paper

Task: Write a 3 ½-5 page **argumentative** research paper in MLA formatting. Your paper should take a stand on a **current** issue that is important to <u>you</u>. You do not have a lot of space to work with, so take on a small, specific aspect of an argument.

This is same type of writing that we have done all year: form a thesis, support it with examples, and tie everything back to the thesis. The difference is that on top of using literature, personal experience, or history, etc. for your examples, your evidence will also come from formal **research**. You will cite sources in the paper (with in text citations) as well as at the end in a "works cited" page.

This is the 3rd type of essay you need to be able to write for the AP exam.

Nuts & Bolts

- -This paper will be a 30 point classwork grade and a 30 point homework grade.
- -All work must be completed on a GoogleDoc so that I can check in on you whenever I have a chance.
- -Your paper has to argue a point.
- -Your paper should use a variety of sources.
- -You will submit your final draft to turnitin.com

Goals

The goals of this paper are manifold. By the end of the paper, you should be able to:

- -Establish ethos
- -Write a clear, concise, **argumentative** thesis statement
- -Use an organizational structure that borrows from either classical or Rogerian structures
- -Use paragraphs in an extended paper
- -Use multiple forms of evidence (emotional appeals, logical appeals, images, etc.)
- -Introduce and discuss evidence
- -Use MLA formatting
- -Cite sources properly
