Lindsey motioned to approve the minutes, Cassie seconded, all in favor

4:05 p.m. Principal's Report

2026-27 student projections

- 263 is our current student enrollment, 216 so far for next year
- Kindie is going from 31 to 41 (probably 3 classes)
- Other grades will remain at 2 classes
- CME leadership was only recently made aware that all of the students currently in CME's new boundary (but previously Heritage Elementary's boundary) are grandfathered into Summit View Elementary and are enrolling there.
- The district will pay Mrs. Broomhead's salary next year so she will stay on

- The interventionists for math and reading may change next year
- The survey is out to the community and staff for budget

iReady mid-year data

The following results are from December's Diagnostic:

Reading

Tier 1 - 72%

Tier 2 - 20%

Tier 3 At risk - 8%

- Foundational reading skills are strong
- All grade levels are proficient in standards
- Plan to support cohorts that have concerns

Math

Tier 1 - 65%

Tier 2 - 31%

Tier 3 At Risk - 4%

- Plan to support cohorts that have concerns (different cohorts than those with concerns in reading)

School Plan

- Essential standards - at the end of the 26-27 school year, 80% of students will demonstrate mastery of grade level essential standards in literacy and math
- Math Reasoning (they can explain their thinking in math) - at the of the 25-26 school year, CME students will earn 10% more of the available points in math reasoning as measured by the 2026 CMAs assessment
- Math Achievement for Students with Disabilities - Improving math achievement outcomes for students with disabilities through integration math differentiators
- Q3 Updates
 - 4 Quadrant PLC Planning - what shifts are we needing to make for groups of students
 - Action Planning at individual student level based on iReady scores
 - Focusing on enrichment and extention
 - Refining check-in/check-out for students with disabilities
 - Student strategies engagement focus
 - Engagement strategy planning menu
 - Instructional strategy spotlight in newsletter
 - Modeling the strategy in staff meetings
 - Reflect and connect the next meeting
- DCSD Draft Cell Phone Policy

- Board policy is drafted and going to board in January and February
- For middle schools and elementary schools:
 - Students must have devices (phones, smartwatches, etc.) silenced (no vibration or sound) and stored during the entire school day
- If approved, CME will start policy after spring break with plenty of communication to the parents
- If approved, 3rd - 6th grade will have calculator pocket chart to turn in devices
- DCSD and CME accept no responsibility for damaged, lost, or stolen devices

- Presented at DAC in November:
 - Sterling Ranch updates are on county website
 - School website has strategic plan that's been presented
 - Safety and security enhancements starting with facility upgrades through BOND and MLO
- Presented at DAC in December:
 - Scheduled PLC time proposal was presented in December (why we need a 45 minute late start on Fridays starting next school year)
 - Right now they are working out transportation and BASE
 - Talked about budget outlook for district
 - Schools must explain budget caring over 1% (keeps schools from hoarding money)

- SACPI - they presented an update on the rubric and talked about career expo feedback

5:35 p.m. Open Forum/Community Concerns

- Spanish Club is on Wednesdays 3:30 - 4:30 (taught by Mrs. Andersen and Mrs. Broomhead); there will be two sessions
- Garden update: Girl Scout Troop 68088 (two 8th graders at MRMS and former CME students) are creating an outdoor learning garden for their Silver Award Project - they will submit a grant request to help cover costs as well as reach out to community partners for donations
- Followup on Wellness Wednesdays - teachers do more to get movement in (jumping jacks, walks outside)
- Followup on last year's book club (The Anxious Generation) - Big push for after school clubs school clubs and asking teachers not to give free time on computers
- Updates on 6th grade transitioning to middle school
 - MRMS is maxed out on enrollment
 - They made offers to 12 feeder area teachers and 11 accepted
 - Hope to hire two additional math teachers and one social studies teacher
 - 6th grade will take up two and a half pods
 - Mobiles will only be used for health class instruction
- Budget survey needs to be filled out this month
- Open enrollment opens January 22
