Perfectly serviceable for me, someone with little to no attachment to the original.

Beautiful, but pretty long for a glorified tech demo. **7/10**

#### **The Current War**

Shockingly good! A complete wild card. Completely didn't expect to enjoy it. **8/10**

#### **Once Upon a Time in Hollywood**

Rivetingly meandering. Answers the question: would I watch a Tarantino character open a tin of dog food. The answer: happily. **8/10**

#### **Good Boys**

More than continues the trend of Seth Rogen being involved with great work. So funny, so true to life. Probably never more than five minutes without laughter. **9/10**

#### **The Informer**

A more than serviceable action drama. Good performances all round. **6/10**

#### **Hustlers**

A wildly enjoyable and well made movie. Standout performance from Jennifer Lopez. **7/10**

#### **Ad Astra**

A thoughtful and mostly (until pirates on the Moon) believable Sci-Fi bolstered by an impeccable performance by Pitt. Definitely felt the length of it though. **7.5/10**

#### **The Kitchen**

Painfully bland and middling, despite it's star studded cast. **2/10**

#### **Ready or Not**

A fun and eccentric Horror, filled with comedic elements. I've always wanted a Horror in which the protagonists react the way I feel I would react: excessive swearing **8/10**

#### **Joker**

An unbelievable performance, excellent set design, let down by the overwhelming hype/controversy surrounding it. (Apparently the "Comedy" that the "Woke Culture" won't let Todd Phillips do is exclusively jabs at little people... -1 point). **7/10**

#### **Abominable**

Definitely lacking the "fun for the whole family" aspect of a Disney film, or the better DreamWorks stuff. This film really works for me on paper: Good cast, quirky characters and creatures, atypical setting, and strikingly vibrant animation; but in practice it just

fell down and felt stale. The former is likely down to the half-hearted performances and the latter is because I've seen Missing Link, which is the better of these two Sasquach/Yeti movies. **5/10**

### **Gemini Man (3D HFR)**

Quite good, but there's a little rubbery-ness and confusion to some of the action and some product placement that's about as subtle as an icepick lobotomy. Also, the HFR makes it feel less cinematic, but that might just be because it's not standard practice. **6/10**

### **Shaun the Sheep: Farmageddon**

Not sure how valid my feelings are on this, since I fell asleep for like 5-10 mins in the middle of it. I enjoyed what I did see, though. **7/10**

### **Zombieland: Double Tap**

Is exactly what you'd expect from a Zombieland sequel. Watching as an adult, I came to the grim realisation that I am a Columbus, who works a 9 to 5 job with a Tallahassee. **8/10**

### **The Addams Family**

Great cast, wonderful animation, lottsa good puns and adult jokes. My favourite part was when they played the classic theme at the end, and everyone snapped along. **8/10**

A well acted production of quite a straightforward concept, with some rather bizarre, roundabout, and at one point distasteful writing to get there. The cast was all great but they probably should have given Helen Mirren more to do. **7/10**

### **Le Mans '66**

Full disclosure, I did miss an undetermined amount of this film because the cinema I went to decided to play less ads than usual and kept fucking quite about it. So I'm not sure what crucial information I'm missing about Matt Damon's heart condition. A great story about two larger than life characters, that I feel was beautifully told by it's creative team. **8/10**
