6th-8th Grade Courses

General Science Lab: This course will be structured after the Apologia General Science textbook. Most Mondays will consist of labs and throughout the week, students will read and answer questions from the text. This course is not for high school credit. The workbook is optional.

English: This course will use the IEW text to guide students through the basics of writing by using Bible stories and verses. Students will learn how to make outlines, use source texts, utilize checklists, understand new vocabulary, and more. This book is written in a way that allows the teacher to guide students at their own pace. It is not for high school credit.

Pre-Algebra: This course is designed to prepare students for algebra class. We will use the Abeka text along with a set of video lessons recorded by Mr. Steve. Students will complete lessons throughout the week, then on Mondays, they will review the lessons with their tutor. This course is not for HS credit. We do recommend that you also purchase the solution key so you can help your students at home and keep up with their homework. We will keep up with the quizzes and tests, so there is no need to buy the quiz and test book.

Middle School US History: This class uses the Notgrass text and is divided into two semesters. The book teaches history from a Biblical worldview and integrated Biblical truth throughout. In America the Beautiful part 1 (1st semester), students will explore from pre-Columbus times until the Civil War. Then part 2 (2nd semester) takes them from the late 1800's into the present time. This course is not for HS credit.

Productivity: This course will focus on important skills the students will need in life, such as time management, typing, office skills, and computer skills. There is no textbook for this course. The teacher will use a combination of websites, video instruction, and hand-outs to teach the class. Students need to have a laptop or a tablet with a keyboard for this class. All software and websites used in the course will be free for the students. Students will need to be able to access Google office suite and several other websites. The teacher will communicate this information with the parents so they can allow access on the student's device.

Public Speaking: This course will not use a textbook. The students should have a three-ring binder with pockets that they can use for the hand-outs the teacher prints for them. The goal of the course is to help them be more comfortable with speaking in public. They will learn through hands-on activities such as impromptu speeches, dramatic reading, and other individual speeches and speaking opportunities.

Art, Choir, and Drama: These courses will not have a text, but will be taught by skilled teachers who will design a syllabus for the students. Teachers may give homework, but these courses should be viewed as a once-a-week course and should not be used for high school credit if the student is in middle school.

9th-12th Grade Courses

Chemistry: This course will use the Apologia chemistry text (3rd Edition). Students will work through the week on reading and answering questions, then in class on Mondays, the teacher will review the concepts and do lab experiments with the students. This class is designed to be for HS credit and the workload will reflect that. The text can be purchased as a physical textbook or an ebook.

Geometry: This course will use the Abeka books Plane Geometry text. This text uses the Euclidean style of teaching geometry with proofs. Students will have access to Mr. Steve's video series as they complete the course and the tutor will review with the students every Monday.
