General Information

The course is designed for students who have an A2-B2 level of English and want to improve their English reading skills. At the tutorials students are offered ESL reading comprehension activities and exercises based on various topics, the ultimate goal of which is the ability to read texts, process them and understand their meaning.

This course also familiarizes students with various reading skills including skimming, scanning, predicting, and reading for detailed comprehension.

Reading can contribute to activating and reinforcing other skills (grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, and writing). It can put grammatical structures, new lexical items into practice, and can also offer good writing models.

Course Objectives

The aim of the course is to develop students' reading comprehension skills and strategies and have them recognize structure, main ideas, supporting details, topics, titles and skim, scan, and order events in texts; increase students' ability to think critically and continue to help students synthesize and discuss ideas from reading, predict content, draw conclusions, and distinguish between facts and beliefs; activate and reinforce students' vocabulary by obtaining or guessing meaning from context, focusing on high frequency words, and identifying synonyms and parts of speech from word endings or word families; build students' language skills through paraphrasing and summarizing of texts, producing grammatically correct sentences or questions.

Course Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of this course students will be able to:

- Increase their reading speed and comprehension of various types of texts;
- Improve their reading fluency skills through extensive reading;
- Understand texts in order to obtain complete information (detailed comprehension or intensive reading);
- Understand texts with coverage of the main content of the text (skimming);
- Understand various types of texts in order to find the necessary information (scanning);
- Analyse, compare and contrast received information.

Course Outline and Teaching Methodology

The course is a combination of contact classes (60 hours) and students' self-study (60 hours). Self-study involves a critical analysis of information obtained during contact classes. Interactive methods such as guided reading, brainstorming, case study, discussion are employed. Students can download all necessary materials for the class on Unikom and self study if needed.
