Topic: Tips for Students to Create a Well Organized Compare and Contrast Essay

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Writing compare and contrast essays is quite common but writing good ones is not that common.

There are people like me who are good with ideas but poor with the organization. It is the fruit of my years of hard work with the organization of an essay that I am sharing with you.

I struggled to write compare and contrast essays, not because I lacked ideas but because I lacked coherence. I would sit to **write my essay** but I would end up writing irrelevant details that disturbed the organization of my essay. Most days I just randomly wrote my ideas without giving much thought to the organization of the essay.

Make an outline.

We all are familiar that making an outline is key to writing a good essay. In a compare and contrast essay, the outline not only helps you create a balance between various segments but it keeps you from deviating from your argument. Sticking to the topic and sticking to the arguments, in turn, ensure the organization of your essay. Like any ideal outline, your outline would include the introduction, body, and conclusion. The body paragraphs would compare and contrast the sources that are the focus of your essay.

Make subsections within an outline.

This was a simple but hard-learned lesson. Now, when I **write essay for me** I make sure that I prepare an outline that has sections and subsections. This helps me focus my essay narrowly and keep it to the point. This minimizes the chances of any extra detail that I might mistakenly add to my essay. You should also make subsections regarding the similarities and differences between your sources and what makes them alike and unlike. Depending on the length of your essay and

the depth of your topic you can divide your essay into as many subsections as you want. They streamline and narrow the focus of your essay.

Relate your topic sentences with your thesis.

If you wish to have a well-organized compare and contrast essay then you must create a direct link between your thesis statement and your topic sentences, as I did. If the thesis statement is a one-line outline of your essay then the topic sentence is a one-line outline for your paragraphs.

We don't give headings in an essay because the topic sentences serve as the headings. Your topic sentence should directly address your thesis statement. They should be so constructed that even if you see them in isolation they must convey the meaning and essence of your whole essay.

Follow the topic sentence.

Everyone knows that a thesis statement is the most important in an essay but not everyone knows the importance of topic sentences. We do write to them if we are mindful of them but then we do not follow them throughout the paragraph. In a **Compare and Contrast Essay**, it is vital to the arrangement of text and to make sure that our essay is engaging. Jumping across themes within a paragraph leaves a bad impression on the reader.

Discuss one idea in one paragraph.

This is a common mistake that disturbs the organization of our compare and contrast essay. We make a well-developed thesis statement and write responsive topic statements as well but adding irrelevant information makes our essay look less coherent. The above-mentioned tip of making sub-sections would prove to be quite helpful in this regard. You would know what to discuss in one paragraph. Write a topic sentence that reflects your thesis. Elaborate on your topic sentence and provide the reason for your claim. Then add direct references from the sources to strengthen your arguments and explain these references as well.

These simple tips will not only help you write a good compare and contrast essay but would also help you improve your observation and argument.
