Post-meeting announcement: the last few technology Mini-Grant applicants are in-process. Many thanks for helping to get the word out and sharing info on this helpful funding!

Heads-up for the <u>Arch National Respite Conference September 14 & 15 2022, in Madison, WI.</u> Lifespan Respite WA has applied to present. The conference this year is in-person only. https://arch.wildapricot.org/2022-Natl-Respite-Conference

Lifespan Respite WA Voucher Program: the team reports that funding levels for the voucher program are lower than previously. To maximize the number of voucher recipients when funding is low, we wait through a 90-day voucher use cycle to award new vouchers, so that we can apply unused voucher funds to another applicant. For equity purposes voucher recipients are chosen to equalize voucher distribution across geographic sections of WA state, as population density in Western WA would otherwise use all available funds.

Efforts continue with the Dan Thompson Grant opportunity, a one-time statewide opportunity to fund projects to serve DDA-eligible individuals on the No-Paid-Services List. Lifespan's application for this funding was not initially approved, but there is a chance of unallocated/unusable funding becoming available.
