#### **Course Description**

Students develop and refine technical skills and create 2-D compositions with a variety of media in drawing, painting, printmaking, collage, and/or design. Student artists sketch, manipulate, and refine the structural elements of art to improve mark-making and/or the organizational principles of design in a composition from observation, research, and/or imagination. Through the critique process, students evaluate and respond to their own work and that of their peers. This course incorporates hands-on activities and consumption of art materials.

#### **Course Grade**

This is a year-long course that meets on an A/B schedule. This class is 4th Period - B Day. Grades are continuously updated as students submit assignments and are synced to Skyward nightly. Major updates and feedback will be provided each Friday or following assignment due dates. Grades will be posted at the semester. A snapshot will be taken at the quarter, but the grade of record will be at the semester. Grade books will reset at the semester

#### **Electronic Device Policy**

Students must come to class every day with their charged Chromebook. During class, the Chromebook should be used only to participate in the class. Students should not have personal electronic devices out during class at any time for any purpose, unless instructed to do so.

#### Kindergarten-8th Grade
