## How to do Green screen

If you would like some video footage with a green screen to play with, <u>go here</u>. (You need a PHRD account to access this.)

- 1. First Crop your footage
- 2. Apply auto contrast (Effects window)
- 3. Apply Ultra Key (Effects window)
- 4. -Select the key colour to be removed (use eye dropper) NOTE: in the new version of Premiere Pro, when you click on the eye-dropper, it doesn't turn into an eyedropper, but it still works the same way. Just click on the eyedropper and click on the green screen.
- 5. Set output to Alpha channel to see what needs to be removed

# If these settings don't entirely work, play with the sliders to make it work better for your footage.

**Under Matte Generation:** 

- 6. -Set Transparency to 37
- 7. -Set Highlight to 10
- 8. -Shadow to 52
- 9. -Tolerance to 20
- 10. -Set pedestal to 100

#### Under Matte cleanup:

- 11. Set Midpoint to 50
- 12. Set Output to back to Composite
- 13. Click on the timeline and hit enter to render whole sequence

- 2. No "Green Glow" around the person.

- 3. Significant movement of characters
- 4. Realistic looking special effect
