- 5. Chair Report Jessica O'Connell
 - a. ASCA Update Megan Jefferies (shared by Jessica)

Megan attended the ASCA conference for over 4 hours. Suzanne stayed for more than 10 hours! Suzanne noted that next year ASCA will offer the option for councils to pool their \$500 ASCE grant towards monthly speakers online - the ASCA All Access Pass.

Dr. Moroziuk cancelled the Council of Councils meeting in April due to lack of attendance and business. It has not been rescheduled.

6. Trustee Report - Greg Schell

Board members will be meeting with city council tomorrow to discuss Cherot school sites. Currently the Area Structure Plan has one K-9 and one high school site designated in the Cherot neighbourhood. Public school board wants the high school site changed to a K-9 for their use as it is larger and closer to the planned rec centre. The current designated K-9 site in Cherot is too small for their plans. GSACRD would like it to remain a high school site for a new Catholic high school. SACHS building is close to 79% utilization, built in 1966 and the site would not support a new building while maintaining students there. Mr Schell suggests emailing city council to advocate for these sites to remain as planned.

Student growth in the district for kindergarten and grade 1 has stayed the same or increased slightly.
