Introduction: A Bill to Establish England's Strategic Nuclear Deterrent

Section I: Purpose

- The Carmarthen Protocol authorises the creation, maintenance, and operational deployment of England's ultimate defensive weapon—a system of naval and aerial nuclear delivery platforms. Like the legendary Black Book of Carmarthen, these weapons are held in reserve, their full power sealed, to be unleashed only in the gravest of threats.

Section II: Authorization

- The governors are empowered to construct and maintain nuclear submarines, and Bombers capable of deploying nuclear devices, once in-game technologies and projects allow.
 - In terms of production, there must be a minimum of 5 regular nuclear bombs and 3 thermonuclear bombs. This number can only be increased with Senate approval.
 - All nuclear-capable units shall be stationed in secure encampments, airdromes, or dockyards, ensuring operational safety and strategic readiness. This, however, can be ignored if the nation is at war or is preparing for one.

Section III: Deployment Rules

- Nuclear strikes may only be authorised by a majority vote of the senate, except in cases of confirmed nuclear attack against England or its allies.
 - In cases of first use, the act must be recorded as an extraordinary measure, with justification presented to the government.

Section IV: Diplomatic Stance

- England affirms that the Carmarthen Protocol exists not for conquest, but to preserve peace and protect allies.
- Any civilisation initiating nuclear aggression against England or her allies will be met with immediate and decisive retaliation.
