

Border Crossings of Regarding Visa on Arrival and e-Visa Eligibility

Laos

This is the official list of all international Lao border crossings, incl. the information whether you can get a visa on arrival or enter with an e-visa at the respective border crossing:

If neither visa on arrival nor e-visa is allowed, you need to get a paper visa at a Lao embassy/consulate beforehand, e.g. in Kunming, Hanoi, Da Nang, Ho Chi Minh City or Bangkok. It is an easy process and takes 24h max. Read the reviews of the embassy/consulate on Google Maps before going there as they can be pretty helpful. With the paper visa you can enter at all international border crossings.

Vietnam

The following map lists all Vietnamese border crossings that are eligible to enter and leave with a Vietnamese e-visa:

Note that, if you have an e-visa, you can only enter and leave (!) at these crossings on that map. At all other international crossings you can only enter and leave visa-free.

Cambodia
