DEBATE

- ★ **lowa Forensic League State Tourney:** *TJ Ascherl* competed at the lowa Forensic League State Tournament and earned a 2nd place finish in Lincoln Douglas. His record was 7-1 with his only loss being in the finals.
- ★ Prestigious Debate Award: David Greiner was awarded the Academic All-American Award by the National Speech and Debate Association (NSDA). This is an honor which is earned by less than 2% of over 120,000 high school debaters nationwide. To earn this award, a student must earn at least a 3.70 (on a 4 point scale) grade point average or must have earned at least a 27 on the ACTs; the student must also have at least 750 NSDA points which are earned through debate tournaments, speech contests, and public speaking. David became the 14th Okoboji High School Student to have earned the Academic All-American Award & the first_since 2014.


