Questions for submitting to workshops / authors of workshop papers

Q: Can I submit my work that is in review at the main ICCV paper track to a workshop?

A: No - this breaks [dual submission rules](#).

Q: What kind of conference registration do I need to present a workshop paper?

A: You need an 'AUTHOR' registration, which is equivalent to the 'Full Passport' registration.

Q: How will Zoom work?

ICCV will set up a microphone and projector in the room, and provide you with a Zoom link that is also accessible to the attendees through the conference portal. The equipment in the room will be able to pipe the microphone input for the room into a PC for transmission via Zoom, typically via a USB device, but you will have to provide the PC. So, e.g., in the past when organizing a workshop, the chairs have brought a separate PC to act as the host within the room. Then, invited speakers can join Zoom and screen share, but use the room mic to transmit their spoken word through the PC to Zoom.

On the day, we recommend that you get there early to test this all out!

Q: Where is my Zoom link?

There is one Zoom license per workshop. How this link works is accessible from the virtual conference site. You may choose whether to expose its "join" link to attendees or hide it from them. If you are only using Zoom to record your event or to support remote speakers, then you should hide the link from your audience. If they see it, they will join. If you want your audience to join the zoom, then you must toggle the link to be visible at <https://iccv.thecvf.com/ZoomInformation/2025-tutorials-workshops>. Only the primary contact of the workshop can use the link. If you are not the primary contact, you will see Permission Denied.

Q: Can I live-stream my workshop publicly?

No, please don't live stream your workshop publicly. Conference attendees have paid money to attend both in person and virtually.

Q: Can I post the recording of my workshop?

Yes, but only 3 months after the conference. ICCV would like to maintain an incentive to attend the conference. Zoom can be used to record your workshop if speakers connect to that Zoom and share their screens.

Q: Where can I find my Zoom recording?

Organizers should be able to log into their accounts at <https://zoom.us> using the credentials provided to them. The recordings should be available in the sidebar.

Q: What are the bounds on my schedule?

A: Workshops can begin anytime at or after 7 AM and must end before 6 PM [2025-08-30 Edit: not 7 PM].

Morning workshops must end by 12:30 PM and afternoon workshops can start at or after 1 PM.

Coffee break: 10 – 11 AM.

Lunch: 12 – 1:30 PM.

Coffee break: 3 – 4 PM.

Q: What is the camera ready upload process?

A: We will send information at the end of July for how to do this. Authors will upload their papers to an IEEE system.

Q: When is the camera ready deadline for workshop papers published in the proceedings?

A: Accepted paper information ('metadata') will be needed no later than July 11th, with camera ready publication files due **Monday August 18th** anywhere on earth.

**Q: Help! I'm using OpenReview and don't know how to easily compile the metadata!
None of the email addresses are visible!**

A: It is not perfect, but please try this python script. It will pull most of the required data, but some hand correction is still needed. See details at the top.

Q: Can I use whichever mechanism I like to organize my workshop?

A: Yes. Some people use CMT3, some OpenReview, you could even use an online form.

Q: How do I add my workshop as a sub-event to ICCV's main OpenReview?

A: Please go to <https://openreview.net/group?id=OpenReview.net/Support> and submit a request form for an OpenReview site for your workshop. The form allows you to specify which conference your workshop belongs to. After you submit the request, OpenReview will create the site under the corresponding main group, like

Q: What are the metadata?

A: We will collect these from you, likely by asking you to complete a spreadsheet. Instructions will be emailed separately.

Per paper: Sequence (if available), Paper ID, Session (if available) [e.g., oral, poster], Title, Contact Author, Contact Author Email, Abstract, Keywords (if available).

Per paper author: Author GivenName, Author Surname, Author Email, Author Affiliation

Q: What page length workshop papers will be archived by CVF and put in the IEEE proceedings?

A: Following CVPR 2025, only long-form papers (e.g., $4 < x \leq 8$ pages). This is consistent with the dual submission policy that papers longer than 4 pages that are peer reviewed count as publications.

Q: Do we have day assignments yet?

Q: Will we receive complimentary registrations for workshop organizers?

A: Yes. Each workshop will receive two full conference passes and three virtual passes.

Q: Will workshops be recorded?

A: Not by default; this is up to each individual workshop to arrange. There will be facility through hybrid access via Zoom for screen share recording. Details are to follow.

Q: Is remote participation possible for attendees? Can we organize a hybrid format?

A: Yes; via Zoom. ICCV will organize this and send details closer to the event. Remote attendees to the conference will be able to access a specific Zoom to your workshop from the conference virtual site. You are free to use this capability or not as you like.

Submission and pre-decision questions

Q: Are decisions out yet? It's past the deadline.

A: Yes, they are out.

Q: It is past the submission deadline. Can I edit my proposal / add more organizers / add more speakers? I even promise that the change is small.

A: No, sorry.

Q: Can you provide me with early feedback on my workshop proposal?

A: No, sorry.

Q: Can I serve as a reviewer?

A: We're afraid not, no. The workshop submissions are jury reviewed by the chairs; there are no external reviewers.

Q: Should my application be anonymous?

A: No. Workshop submissions are not blind; please do not anonymize your submission.

Q: Can my workshop be remote only?

A: No. Workshops are primarily in person even if they might have some remote component.

Q: Can my speakers be remote?

A: In-person speakers are strongly preferred and the review process will prioritize workshops with in-person speakers.

Q: Do my speakers need to register for the conference?

A: Yes. To be let into the conference venue, everyone will need a valid badge. Typically, a reduced rate just for workshop attendance is available, or for one-day attendance. Not yet confirmed, but workshop organizers may also receive a small number of registration codes.

Q: I want to run a competition. Are there any special considerations?

A: All competitions are organized by the specific workshop organizers. There is no additional framing by the conference around competitions. The timeline is set by the competition workshop organizers, the data and compute for the competition is arranged by the workshop organizers, and there are no specific guidelines from the workshop chairs. In reviewing the proposals, the workshop chairs will assess how convincing the proposal is for the competition in terms of the likely ability of the workshop proposal team to successfully execute it.

Q: Poster session outside of workshop hours:

Can we hold the main workshop activities (invited talks and oral presentations) within the half-day session, while scheduling poster presentations during a separate poster session outside workshop hours? E.g., workshop in the morning, posters in the afternoon?

A: No; please don't plan for this. The specific space available is not yet known, and will be determined based upon the requests of workshops for posterboard slots and the available space at the conference center. There is no guarantee that space will be available outside of your workshop hours, as other workshops may need that space. If your workshop is accepted, then more detailed space planning instructions will be provided much closer to the conference.

Q: Workshop poster session location:

Will posters be presented in the same room as the workshop, or in a larger hall designated for posters from all workshops?

A: This is still to be determined, so please don't plan for it. At past CVF conferences, many variations have occurred, including situations where posters were not allowed to be put up in the workshop talks room.

Q: To fit within the 5-page limit, can we remove the descriptive text?

E.g., "Topics that will be covered, audience, and relevance to the computer vision community and potential ICCV 2025 attendees."
