Keyword: Please write 3-5 keywords in alphabetical order, separated by semicolons (;), using 9-point Arial font with 1-point spacing. Keywords should represent the main issues/topics/themes discussed in the article

INTRODUCTION (Arial / Bold / 12)

This section presents a comprehensive overview of the issue or theme that serves as the central focus of the article. It includes a clear problem statement, supported by a background analysis and a relevant literature review that outlines the evolution of ideas and highlights current developments related to the topic. If the research involves a preliminary assumption or hypothesis to be tested, it should also be stated within this section as an integral part of the narrative, rather than as a separate subsection (Times New Roman / 10 / 1.0 spacing)

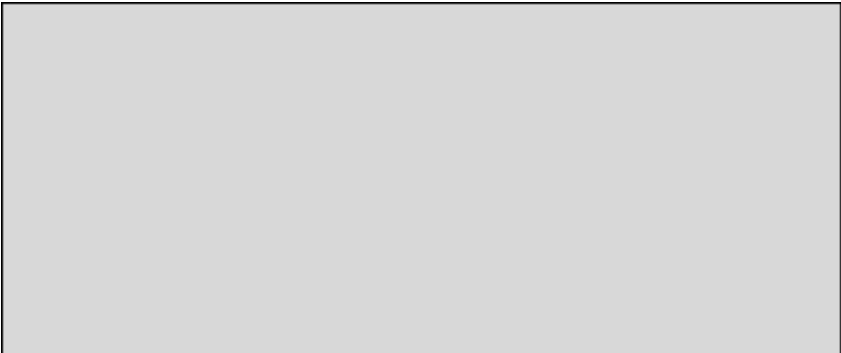

Avoid rewriting sentences from previous chapters; try to put together a new, more comprehensive understanding. Don't hesitate to mention the limitations of your research and provide ideas for future studies.

The Acknowledgements, Fundings, Data availability statement, and Author contribution statement sections must be typed using Times font size 9 points. All of this information must be presented directly in narrative form without using additional titles or subheadings above it.

REFERENCES (Arial /Bold / 12)

The reference list must include all sources cited, following the APA Style 7th Edition standards. To maintain scientific quality, authors must prioritize recent literature (maximum 10 years old) with high credibility to demonstrate the novelty of the topic discussed.

Authors are strongly advised to use reference management software such as Zotero, Mendeley, or EndNote. The use of these tools aims to ensure the accuracy of citations and consistency of format throughout the manuscript, thereby minimizing human error in writing the bibliography.
