Types of sound effects

1. Hard sound effects

Foley sound effects are performed by foley artists and are recorded live. The foley artist synchronises the sound with the characters movements and activities for example, rustling of clothes, tapping on a board with a pen, etc. The most common foley sound effects which are highly used are the sound of footsteps.

3. Background sound effects

Background sound effects which are also often called as atmosphere sounds or nature sounds are more commonly used when making a music video or a film. These sound effects do not necessarily sync with what is happening in the video but are an indication of what is happening in the background which helps the listeners or video audience to understand the setting of the video. These sounds include forest sounds, crowd sounds, buzzing of lights, rain sounds, etc.

4. Design sound effects

Design sound effects are the effects that don't normally occur naturally and are created to give a certain feel to the music or scene. These include sci-fi sounds which are used in a sci-fi movie or song to create the right mood.

Whether you want to create a good video or an engaging audio, sound effects play a very important role in making a connection with the audience and creating the right mood. When creating music, sound effects can be used in various ways by adding a bit of a rhythm and beat to the sound before using it in your audio song. example, if your song is about nature and wildlife or anything with that context, nature sounds like forest sounds, rustling leaves, etc. can be included in your audio.
