1. Purpose

The Marmot City Strategic Delivery Partnership (MCSDP) leads the strategic coordination and delivery of the Fairer, Healthier Leeds action plan and wider programme.

2. Vision and Aims

To achieve the vision of a Fairer, Healthier Leeds the partnership aims to:

- Provide strategic leadership in the city for action on the social determinants of health.
- Lead the development and implementation of the Fairer, Healthier Leeds action plan.
- Enable collaboration across sectors, ensuring that opportunities to embed health equity and address health inequalities are maximised.

3. Governance and interdependencies

- The MCSDP is accountable to Leeds Health and Wellbeing Board and provides annual updates on progress against the Fairer, Healthier Leeds action plan and indicator set.
- The MCSDP has important strategic relationships with Leeds City Council's Corporate Leadership Team and the city's Partnership Leadership Team.
- Political leadership is through the Executive Member for Equality, Health and Wellbeing.
- The Senior Responsible Officer for the Fairer, Healthier Leeds programme is the Director of Public Health with delegated authority to the Deputy Director of Public Health.
- There are important interfaces between the MCSDP and the 'Health and Housing Steering Group', and Children and Families governance structures.
