

Misty Fog Pattern

This hat is simple and beginner friendly. As long as you know how to join in the round, knit, purl, and sew a hat shut you'll be good to go! I used [Lion Brand's Mandala Watercolor](#) yarn, but you can use any brand and color you want. This is my first pattern, so you might have to adjust the gauge and stitches to your liking.

Gauge and Yardage;

12 sts in 13 rows = 2"
1 skein of Lion Brand's Mandala Watercolor

Materials;

- Lion Brand's Mandala Watercolor (or the yarn of your choosing.)
- US 8/5.50 circular needles (or the size the yarn calls for).
- Row counter (optional).
- Stitch marker.
- Tapestry needle.

Notes;

Once you've finished the 2x2 ribbing you can purl two rows or knit three to four rows (which is what I did).

Key;

CO = Cast on

BO = Bind off

St(s) = Stitch(es)

K = Knit

P = Purl

YO = Yarn over

Let's begin;

CO 72 sts for teenage/young adult size.

CO 82 sts for adult size.

Once all sts are co, **make sure the sts aren't twisted**, then place the stitch marker on the right hand needle and join in the round with a knit st.

Row 1: k2, YO p2 until you reach the marker. End with YO and 2 purl sts

Row 2: slip marker, repeat row 1 until you have 16 rows in 2x2 ribbing

Switch to stockinette

Knit 3 rows in stockinette, slipping the marker each time you reach it.

Switch to purling

Row 19: YO, purl 2 rows, slipping the marker.

Switch back to stockinette

Row 21: Knit 6 rows then switch back to purling, continuing to slip the marker.

Continue rows 19 & 21 until piece measures 9”(20cm)

Cut approximately 15” of your working yarn to begin the BO process. Thread the yarn end through your tapestry needle and begin slipping your sts onto the needle. Pull the tapestry needle until your piece begins to close. Once shut, thread the needle through the middle of your work. Flip the hat inside-out and push your needle horizontally through the closed area.

Finally, tie the yarn 2 or 3 times and cut it. Weave the CO yarn into the bottom of your work.

And violá! Your hat is finished! I hope this pattern was helpful. :)
