(4) Novelty, contains aspects of the novelty of the research to be conducted and its contribution to the field and related topics. (5) Significance of the research, contains why this research is important to do (6) Specific main objectives to be answered in the research.[1]

LITERATURE REVIEW

The literature review is written in 500 to 2001 words. The literature review should present the general picture within which the focus of the study may fit. For example, how "motivation" may fit into "foreign language education." It also should contain the conceptual definition of the study's main concepts or variables and theoretical support.
