an apostrophe should not affect the pronunciation, or have any sort of stop, e.g it would not produce a glottal stop, or a click

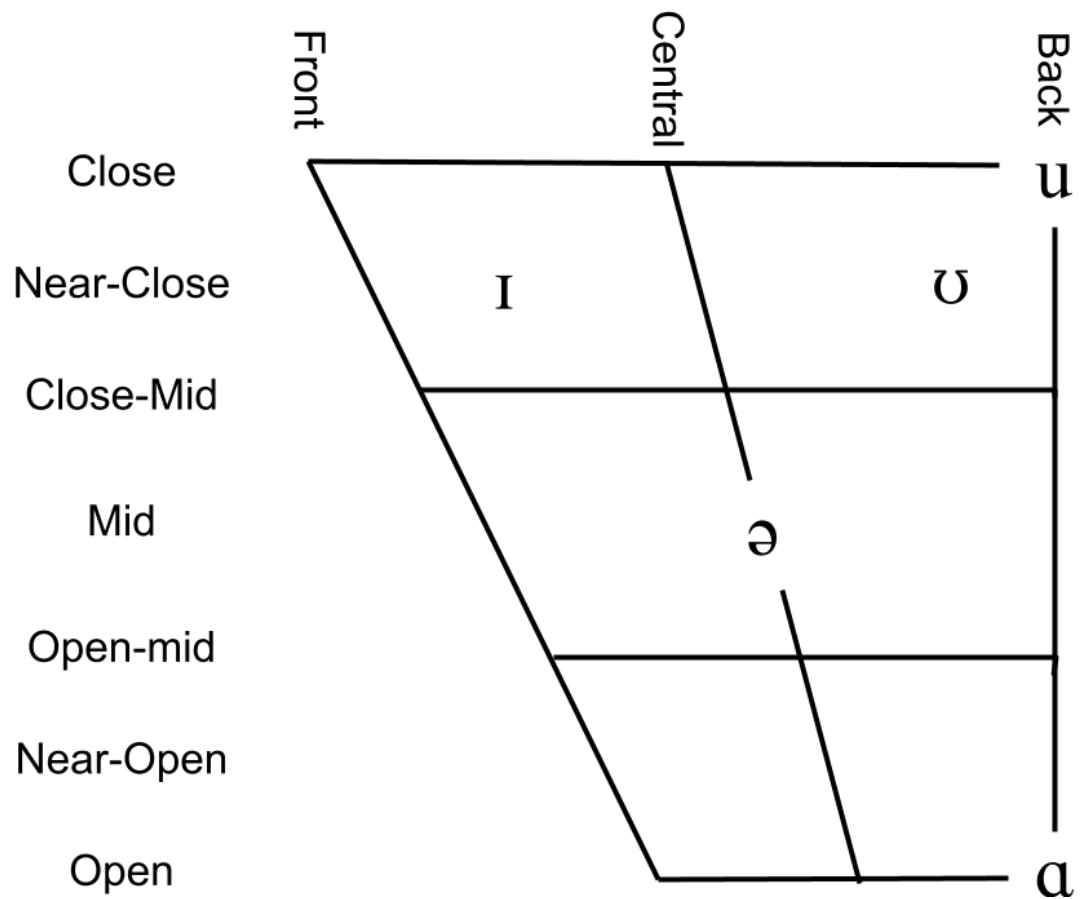
if a word is defined to use an apostrophe, but not a regular form, it may not be put on it's own

#### Phonotactics:

- start of a word may have up to three consonants, but it is recommended to have at least one
  - no more than two consonants may precede a vowel
  - consonant only words may ignore this rule
- end of a word may have max ONE consonant if it has a vowel
  - a word does not require a vowel
  - attached words DO NOT account for the previous two rules
- there is no limit to the amount of vowels that can be placed
  - if possible, avoid using the first vowel (at the ending vowels)
- NEVER repeat a vowel or consonant (e.g. no ⟨oo⟩ or ⟨hh⟩)
