General questions or comments about Network ReVision

What would CFA's role be in Option 1 (Democracy Framing), Option 2 (Mutual Aid), & Option 3 (Advocacy)?

How is CFA applying an equity lens to each of these options?

Option 1: Democracy Framing

The primary purpose and value of the Brigade Network is to strengthen our democratic institutions using the tools of technology and to engage and activate new civic leaders.

- vibe with this when democracy is a very broad scope, but also maybe needlessly filtering (e.g., people might not think to join a “democracy” org if they’re interested in something softer, like running a social media political campaign to advocate for saving a youth skate park, but they might be

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convinced to join a “civic [tech]” group... sorry, this story applies more for “OpenX” brigades, but maybe not “Code for X” brigades, who already seem very “code” ish)

- This is what Code for San Jose does best. We bring the technical and design power to bring community ideas to life.
- "*using* the tools of technology" is very different from "*building* the tools." Using is necessary for anyone trying to make change today; building is what most tech people are looking to do when they show up to our Brigade.

Option 2: Mutual Aid with Technology

The primary purpose and value of the Brigade Network is to organize and redistribute technology skills locally, wherever they are needed most and in a values-driven way. We are the 'mutual aid' of technology.

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- love that “mutual aid” is very non-specific to tech (nice grounding, like “tech” visiting a friends home, instead of vice versa)
 - how can building infrastructure be done as a volunteer effort? Can it be done? CfA's own infrastructure building effort is not really very "open", more "GTD/sprint" oriented....
 - This seems to resonate with our brigade but also strikes me as very heavy on resourcing, which is where we've really felt weakest (both as

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a brigade and in terms of the support - or lack thereof - coming from CfA).

- “mutual aid” maybe rhymes with “peer-to-peer” in neat ways

Can the "meta projects" (open-disclosure, courtbot, others which more than one brigade replicate) be made easier to replicate? Who should manage this?

- the idea of aiding replication feels like a very natural volunteer-based extension of what CfA does with its internally-developed apps; but it runs a little counter to the theme of "locally"

The term “Mutual-aid” seems misused. Maybe Community Tech?

This is what most of our members are interested in.

Option 3: Advocacy Orientation

The primary purpose and value of the Brigade Network is to advocate for policy and systems-change in government, through the lens of technology, human-centered design, and digital services.

- I am excited about this idea and option, but the question that exists in my mind is how does our current community which is heavy in software developers fits into this sort of focus, which might call upon a different skill set.
- (Wes Rowe) 1) from a people perspective, this sounds like consulting outfit with mostly quite senior people in their disciplines; that doesn't describe most of the people I've met in the LA Brigade. What role would more junior people have? 2) operationally, the fact that volunteer hours don't typically overlap with government hours is a huge barrier to influencing the latter; in practice, volunteer projects

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need to do most of their work outside of 9-to-5.

We focus on social justice in data compilation/analysis, policing policies & data, open data policy, open meeting policy
