



Call for Papers: MAEMHS Conference 2023



Abstract Submission Guidelines

- Title of abstract should be in Times New Roman, font size 14pt, concise, descriptive and preferably not exceeding 15 words
- Abstract should be written in Times New Roman, font size 12pt, single-spacing with a maximum of 250 words.
- Abstract should be structured consists of:
 1. Introduction
 2. Objective
 3. Method
 4. Results
 5. Conclusion
- Provide up to 5 keywords separated with semicolons.
- All abstracts **MUST** be submitted and presented in British English written language.
- All abstract submissions must strictly follow the template provided.
- Write the full name of each author and underline the surname.
- Affiliation of each author needs to be in numbering superscript and including the country.
- Identify the corresponding author with an asterisk and provide the email address of the corresponding author.
- Deadline for submission of the abstract is **31st January 2023**. Notification of acceptance will be announced from **15th January 2023 and onwards**.

Easy Steps to Submit Your Abstract

- Step 1: Please return to the conference registration form using your registered email
- Step 2: Click 'EDIT YOUR RESPONSE' and find the 'ABSTRACT SUBMISSION' section.
- Step 3: Click the provided link to complete the abstract submission form and deposit your document in the system.

ABSTRACT

This is the structured abstract consisting of *Introduction, Objective, Method, Results* and *Conclusion*. The abstract should be written in Times New Roman, font size 12pt, single-spacing with a maximum of 250 words.

Keywords: maximum of five keywords; separated by semicolon;
