CRB: Recently Released and Forthcoming 2020-21 Books Call for Pitches for the online journal

We have four main criteria that a review we publish should shoot for:

- 1. Engage with the text or artifact in a faithful way: provide us an entry point into its world.
- 2. Place the book or artifact in a critical context (are there any akin works with similar ambitions? Is there something important about the time and place of the work's production and publication?)
- 3. Connect the work to some aspect(s) of contemporary culture, preferably relevant to the Midwest or Rust Belt (can be concrete or abstract and doesn't have to be forced).
- 4. Shoot for 1000 words.

Find in this document publishers whose work we admire and would love to have reviewed.

We are also open to reviews of already published books and/or classic books (well-known or overlooked) if it's the right fit.

Email us at **pitches@clereviewofbooks.com** if you are interested in writing and please provide a brief description (a few sentences) of an angle you could anticipate taking in writing the piece. Please do not simply email us the name of the book you'd like to review.

We are also open to "cultural criticism" pitches on any arts events in the Midwest and Rust Belt, whether it's a nuanced look at a football rivalry game or a review of an art exhibition.

You can also pitch the "Midwestern Canon" series of features on various canonical Midwestern books, that are classics, overlooked, or books not usually thought of as Midwestern that arguably are in some way. Feel free to pitch features of books you propose to have included.

Find an exhaustive list of publishers who we admire and reviews of whose work we'd love in our pages. On their websites you can easily navigate to find recent releases and forthcoming titles, usually in their

catalogues. The main criteria in choosing a book should be interest and relative expertise, but having an idea of how a review of a certain work might be timely, and knowing that putting out a review around the publication date of the book, are also very important things to be aware of.

While we care more about how a review functions as its own critical work more than its existence on a spectrum from pan to rave, the following publishers mostly put out great work: a mix of serious + ambitious fiction, laser-focused non-fiction, formally experimental poetry, accessible academic-lite studies, and regional explorations. The presses are mainly independent/small with a huge community focus, or university (mainly regional) affiliated, or simply have a long tradition of publishing stellar work.
