Handbook Spotlight

This week's spotlight Expectation is:

ASSIGNMENT COMPLETION POLICY

The following expectations are designed to promote responsibility, provide support, and ensure academic success for all students.

- Timely Completion Required:
 - o Students are expected to submit all assigned work on the due date (unless absent). Completing all

assignments is mandatory; incomplete work is not considered an option.

- Students who have missing work or failing grades will meet weekly with our At-Risk Coordinator.
- Late Work Policy:
 - Teachers will have the discretion to deduct points for work that is submitted late.
- Consequence System for Late Work:
 - Students who do not submit work on the due date will:
 - Stay in during their designated recess time to complete missing assignments
 - Be assigned to a designated study hall (for one week or more if they continue to have missing assignments) to complete the assignment.
- Excessive failure to complete assignments will include:
 - Students are referred to the problem-solving team, which includes teachers, other staff, parents, and the student.
 - The team will work together to develop a Tier 2 intervention plan.
 - Examples of Tier 2 interventions include:
 - Assignment completion contracts
 - Check-In and Check-Out
 - Small group lessons (focusing on organization and time management, etc.)
- Parents and teachers may request a problem-solving meeting at any time if they are concerned about students who habitually have incomplete assignments
- After multiple interventions have been tried and no improvement has been seen:
 - The problem-solving team will reconvene and create a Tier 3 intervention. This would be a more individualized plan tailored to the student's specific needs.

Eligibility for Extracurricular Activities

Students with a failing grade (F) in any class are ineligible to participate in extracurricular events. This ineligibility period runs from **Wednesday to the following Wednesday**.

All makeup and missing assignments must be submitted to teachers by the end of the school day on **Tuesday**. This allows teachers to update grades by 4:00 p.m.

Parents and students will be notified on **Wednesday** if the student is ineligible for that week's activities.

On Wednesday, September 17th, the initial grade drop for academic eligibility will occur. To be eligible, all student-athletes must submit any missing assignments by Tuesday, September 16th. Any student-athlete with a failing grade will be notified of their ineligibility on Wednesday, September 17th.

Weekly grade drops will continue throughout the fall sports season. A new eligibility date for the winter sports season will be announced at a later time.
