- ❖ **Urgent Need Program by Leukemia and Lymphoma Society**
Eligibility:
Must be a pediatric or young adult (birth to 39 years of age) patient OR be an adult (40+ years of age) patient AND
Be a United States citizen or permanent resident of the U.S. or U.S. territory and have a blood cancer diagnosis confirmed by the care team AND
Must demonstrate acute financial need, as defined by the program covered expenses and Patients may be insured or uninsured, but not required. This program helps people with income at or below 600% of federal poverty guidelines.

Description: The Urgent Need Program offers eligible patients assistance for non-medical expenses.

This program provides:

- Lodging

- Elder care
- Food

- Car insurance
- Phone service
- Acute dental work related to treatment

❖ **Medical Debt and Hospital Bill Financial Assistance by Dollar For**

This program serves those that are unable to pay their hospital bills.

Description:

WHAT IS CHARITY CARE?

Most hospitals offer discounts or bill forgiveness based on income. This is called “charity care.” A hospital bill for \$15,000 could become \$150 — or even \$0. WHO QUALIFIES FOR CHARITY CARE? Each hospital runs its own

charity care program. Each decides how patients must apply and who qualifies. On average, a family of 4 earning less than \$100,000 a year will qualify.

HOW DOES DOLLAR FOR HELP?

Dollar For helps you apply for financial assistance from your hospital. We don't pay your bills — we get the hospital to forgive them. Our services are completely free.

❖ **Financial Assistance by Patches of Light**

The child must be diagnosed with a catastrophic illness that requires the family to forego their normal schedule of support.

Request for assistance is an obligation/need causing detriment to the family and care of child. (Past due utility, need for food, gas, mortgage, etc.)

Description: Patches of Light assists families with children facing catastrophic health issues and financial hardship.

This program provides:

- Help to pay for utilities
- Help to pay for housing
- Gas cards
- Grocery cards

Applications will take 2-3 weeks to be considered. Applications must come from hospital staff working with the family. Families may not apply for assistance themselves.

Patches of Light works through the child's medical team to verify authenticity and retain strict confidentiality of the situation presented.

Therefore, they will no longer be able to accept phone calls, emails, or have personal contact from the applicant or family members pertaining to the application and/or outcome of said application.

It would be of great benefit to both the petitioner and Patches of Light if each request made were followed by an email confirming their arrival.

Often due to technology and security they do not receive the initial application and are unaware an application has been submitted. A quick email to check on its arrival saves time and allows them to process the application in a timely manner.

❖ **ACTION Inc.**

ACTION works with individuals who have experienced a crisis in their lives that has caused them financial hardship. Examples are the loss of a job or other loss of income that has occurred within the past 60 days, through no fault of the individual. Additional extenuating situations may include incurring unforeseen. medical bills, automobile repair, and funeral costs due to a death in the immediate family. All assistance requests require validation as well as required documentation; a list of required documentation may be obtained by calling our county office. Our County Coordinator is available for budget, rental, employment, housing counseling, educational counseling. Primarily, our goal is to work with individuals on a long-term basis to help them move their lives forward, through education and education-based training opportunities.
