Only two matches to go!

And for both PPP and TT, this may be the last match of the season for them.

So much has happened over the season and I hope a lot of the players will take pen to paper and write about their experiences once the season ends on May the 13th.

PPP take a one goal lead into this 2nd leg SF. This leg is a match that was postponed from earlier in the season. A lot of adjusting of the fixtures happened because the rule to continue with the matches with a reduced player-per-side quota came in much later.

One must wonder what the results would've been if the rule was implemented at the beginning of the season. Simply because the two PCF players that played in that fateful first leg and were instrumental in the goal that's put PPP 1 nil up, wouldn't have played.

So many permutations and combinations, it boggles the mind!

The session on Thursday brought doubts in my mind whether what I've been saying all along was true. (One of the teams in the short game played as if they had no confidence and no idea about tactics). That the players have progressed so much that their inclination is to talk about tactics and strategies than to talk about how sexy

a goal was or what a good player so and so is. This kind of talk is the talk of a fan. The kind of talk where the Clubs focus on tactics is called progress.

Little do the players realize that just one or at least 2 seasons at KFANDRA; including the off-seasons, is enough for each player to go out and coach any amateur side in the world. Some may even be able to coach a pro-club side.

A KFANDRA player looks at a goal from at least a minute before the goal was scored. Hence, the HS, where the goals are shown with either the build up that makes it special or the goof-up that led to the goal. That's why the HS includes the name of the player that was involved in the goal when he passed to the fellow that gave the final assist. Which is why when a mistake is made, usually the opposition player gets a hand in the goal too.

The two Clubs have to approach this match, not only as a Cup SF 2nd Leg match, but as a match that has been arranged to test their knowledge of the game.

The questions they need to constantly ask themselves are, when should they change the plan? Should they make a positional change? Is the plan working? Is there enough time left to make the change? And I can go on and on.

A player with no knowledge of tactics, or a fan-player just thinks for himself and wonders which players in his team can help him play well. A player low on confidence is just focused on not making mistakes, when little does he understand that his teammate may be thinking the same thing. Two players thinking only about themselves is not good for any side. In this democratic set-up, with the BP and C to guide the players, everyone has to speak. The Captains are there to take the final call, after which everyone must follow that final call, without grumbling.

PPP are faced with rotating 4 OFL players throughout the game. What is important is that they rotate the players to ensure that their own players get proper game-time in their own preferred positions. This is the KFANDRA Way.

But, in circumstances as this 2nd leg match, sometimes sacrifices are needed, but only if the players asked to make a sacrifice agree. For eg, if one of the players can defend with his eyes closed, is this the match where you'd ask one of your players that's still learning the game and is still low on confidence, to play in defence while the loanee plays up front?

I know the answer to this question. But it's a Club match and sometimes tough decisions need to be taken. This should be fun!

I'm extremely confident in the players and I'm sure we'll have a rip-roaring match in store.

dribbling through our defence. But I could neither control the ball fully nor let it run clean through to our GK. For eg. perfection for most every human is to find a brilliant and loving partner, make a lot of money, enough at least to support your family of which your kids are as you'd dreamed they'd be, and live the rest of your life being happy.

Some jump into the sea searching for perfection, which is a treasure chest in some chasm below the seabed, without carrying a life jacket and with no plans.

Some jump in with precautions in place.

Some don't jump in immediately but bide their time.

And some never jump in.

At KFANDRA, the KLC4 was started with the belief that all those months of training, would bring the players as close to perfection as possible. The plans were set and the BP and C were created. Jumping into the sea wasn't as precarious as it could've been.

Unfortunately, the players felt that the plans and precautions weren't strong. And they jumped in without KFANDRA's backing, they believed that their way was the right way and that's why the season almost ended before it started. With the deduction of points signalling the warning to the Clubs that all wasn't well and that the players and Clubs were seconds away from sinking into the deep, dark sea.

But, the Clubs and players pulled through, they decided to trust the BP and C and threw their doubts away.

And this is where we are now. Reading a review about the 2nd last match of the season. And what can be said? Are we close to perfection?

Perfection, taken in this context and not some treasure in the sea, would be if the players went completely by the BP and C in terms of the match and respected each other on and off it. That they arrived at the match on time and helped set up everything together.

Once you look at perfection in these terms than we are still a ways away from achieving it.

In this match I threatened a player that I was on the verge of saying it just can't work any more.

That too, the KLC4 after such a poor start, was on the verge of breaking all records. Basically, the one's that I created in my mind.

That such a hotch potch of egos and personalities, could merge and flow as if they were symbiotic in nature. Some relationships have grown but some have been quite fractious.

Perfection? So close but still so far.

The match

It began as I expected it to; especially so as I sensed the players were extremely nervous, with errors strewn all about the place.

What made it unlike a typical FIFA amateur match, was the fact that the players were mature enough to try and build up the game from the back. This is unseen of in the outside world, when KFANDRA is what to us is the world. Playing out from the back settled nerves and made the game look very professional.

Both teams were trying to find a way through and it was so typical of a well contested chess match. They fizzled each other out most times.

What got the breakthrough for both sides were mistakes.

For TT's first two goals, S. Inamdar did the unthinkable for giving away a POP and Kothari and Bhorde GKL messed up their roles.

S. Inamdar expressed his confusion at what happened, for he felt he got a touch on the ball before Patwardhan collided with him. In the ref's view, as Inamdar rushed back he managed to get a touch on the ball with his heel. He was now twisting towards his own goal and as the ball hit his heel, he was unaware of the where the ball was going. The ball was in fact rolling to a stop between Inamdar's legs as he placed his right leg down ready to turn. Just at that moment, Patwardhan kicked the ball through Inamdar's legs and rushed to go round Inamdar. The timing was

extremely bad for Inamdar. For as Patwardhan touched the ball, Inamdar's foot touch the ground and there was built an impenetrable wall that Patwardhan crashed into. For PPP lone effort, Joshi did the FIFA marking crap that is banned at KFANDRA. He was extremely lucky that the ref did not award a POP and a red card. PPP scored so he'd have been back on anyway.

TT's 3rd goal happened because PPP couldn't get rid of the ball properly. By giving Patwardhan a lot of space, they should've been aware while defending, but they weren't. I noticed Gurhani was offside on the far side but he was not involved in play. After the match, Khan kept saying that he was in such a position where he saw Kadam, S. Inamdar and himself were ahead of Joshi of TT but Mishra was still a yard behind, and that he was trying to tell Mishra the same thing.

There were a number of things that went wrong with this offside trap. The first question was, that even if the plan was to catch offside, how come the ball was played between Mishra and Khan? What happened to compact defending? For an offside trap, the last man, one of the two Cd's S. Inamdar or Mishra has to step up to catch offside. If the opposition players gets caught offside off a static back four unit, that that player is crap. For this goal, Mishra actually took a step back when the ball was played. In any case, Mishra was putting Joshi onside with his positioning. Mishra's arm went up in a last gasp hope that Joshi may be offside.

This was one match where the ref was least bothered with the appeals and used his experience to take the decisions.

Bhorde must also be blamed for his Keeping. For such a fine player outfield, Bhorde couldn't play as well as I know he can, in goals. Joshi literally side stepped the ball into the D and scored. Bhorde's positioning was poor, and he kept hesitating on whether to charge or hang back.

With TT deciding to defend, the nerves left PPP and they created a few chances. TT also created quite a few chances too, chances that were bound to arise from the counter attacking strategy.

I'm just happy that it wasn't the ref's decision that caused one team to lose and one team to win.

Important notes -

I thought out of the loanee's, M. Inamdar was the most focused. He covered a lot of ground while doing BRE work and was concentrating so much during the CPC work that he was bent over and all that was left was to give him a microscope and a test tube.

This was the last time Joshi will get away with shite. He's been with us for a little more than a month I think and the newbie tag is off. His reaction after the ref awarded the POP and during a couple other incidences was not abiding by the KFANDRA Ethos, and if he carries on this way, he will get carded.

I'd have immediately asked PPP to switch a few positions around and change the plan at the last moment.

Oh yes, this is a part of football too. Sometimes well laid out plans have to be scrapped. It's these decisions that make good learning.

Aha! What is important to add is that the change would always have to come through me. Simply because you chaps have come to play and not coach and you don't want to go trampling on your teammates egos.

And finally Babhale, who can't seem to shake off bad habits. I really like the guy as I like all my players, and I can tell you chaps that the chaps I don't like, KFANDRA won't keep. But Babhale is treading on extremely thin ice and unless he makes an effort to change, the writing is on the wall. Bechara Kadam bore the brunt of Babhale temper as Kadam was the path of least resistance and also because he was playing on the left. Let me ask Babhale, who made Babhale confident to play on the left? Before he says anything, let me quickly say it was me. This was only because I knew he could make that place his own, way back in those KITFO days. But why can't he play the same way on the right or in any position for that matter? You see, it's all in the mind. And his mind needs a big massive clean up. Kadam's such a nice guy and I feel for him.

I love the mavericks and the cheeky sods too, for without them this world would be boring, but I feel more for the quiet and unassuming chaps. For these guys, I have to work hard on them in different ways. For the over confident fellows, all what is needed is for them to deal with their egos.

The Loanees

(I did not help PPP with their positioning of the loanees, this was all PPP's doing). Jobanputra was brilliant in goals, for goalkeeping is mostly being loud. A GK allows a team to grow in confidence and Jobanputra was all that and more. His kicking was perfect with the tee and without. Inamdar has reached a position of stature now at KFANDRA. He doesn't know this but I'm telling him now. I know my players inside out and I know Inamdar has nothing left to prove. All he can do is improve on the strong levels he's already at. What PPP needed was Inamdar's composure and not

his panic. They needed his Marathi and not his English. One thing he can work on though, is his tendency to dwell on his own mistake or a teammates. He should learn to move on quickly.

The players

Ghotge and Kothari are in the same sort of position right now. Nice players that will sacrifice everything for the good of the team. But they make too many errors and don't seem to get upset with those errors. They must show more emotion!

S. Inamdar and Pardeshi could've switched more often. Inamdar deserved some time up front to try and turn things around. Pardeshi had to prove that he can play just as well in Cd like before. I told PPP not to risk Babhale because he's too much of a maverick. Maybe in the future when he calms down.
