I. Citation

158 U.S. 601, 15 S.Ct 673, 39 L.Ed. 1108 (1895)

II. The Facts

A. Material

The Constitution gave the States power to impose direct taxation. The Federal government could also impose direct taxes, but only if those taxes were apportioned among the states in proportion to their representation in Congress.
