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Prayer Room Resources & Materials for Distribution

Items to provide in a Muslim prayer space:

- Prayer rugs
- *Turbah* prayer stones
- *Tasbeih* prayer beads
- Copies of the Quran in Arabic and English
- Scarves and prayer covers for women, some Muslims also prefer a privacy screen for women
- *Qiblah* direction indicator marking the direction of prayer towards Mecca (northeast for most of North America, note that magnetic interference from a building can make it difficult for a compass or phone to work in the building, the Pillars app has a *qiblah* finder that can be used away from the magnetic interference to determine the direction).
- Depending on the institutional needs, storage space may facilitate regular users to leave prayer garments in the space and shoe racks or cubbies and reduce tripping hazards during prayer times.
