(Carrie) ● Question about boosterton fundraising amounts: most \$ made from direct donations, some from sponsorships. ● \$34,000 from boosterthon is net \$ made from fundraiser (up from \$29,000 made last year - makes sense with new students). Shirts cost \$2000 (Joey) ● We don't always use all funds allocated in budget (Carrie) ● In addition to budget line items, teachers can also submit grant requests which PTA board votes on.
