Workflow

All content must be submitted to bit.ly/bsphstudentdigest to be approved or denied by the Office of Student Life team in 3-5 business days. Pieces that are targeted to ALL BSPH STUDENTS will be included in the Weekly Student Digest that is disseminated on Sundays by the Student Assembly account. If the submitted piece due date or event date falls too soon from the digest send date on Sundays, the piece cannot be included.

Pieces that are targeted to certain majors or degree groups within BSPH will be sent directly to the groups via the Student Assembly email as long as the requested turn around date for send falls beyond the 3-5 day approval/denial date.

Pieces targeted to certain identity groups (international students, ethnicities, etc.) will be sent directly to the groups via the Office of Student Life email as long as the requested turn around date for send falls beyond the 3-5 day approval/denial date.

Approved/Rejected

All submissions are subject to approval/rejection by the discernment of the Office of Student Life team and Student Affairs department. Any piece with language or content deemed hurtful, inequitable in representation, biased, limiting certain group's rights, or ineffectively tackling a current political/moral climate issue, is subject to further consultation or pulled from dissemination.
