
12 Honors English Summer Reading 2022

As part of your upcoming curriculum for the 2022-2023 school year in English, you will be expected to read the following text and complete the following assignment. This is **separate** from any summer reading that may be assigned through the library/Clipper Block, which you are also expected to do.



Read *Invisible Man* by Ralph Ellison and complete the introduction and reading assignments.

** Make sure you get <u>Invisible Man</u> by Ralph Ellison, **NOT** <u>The Invisible Man</u> by H.G. Wells. **

Assignment Overview:

- 1. Log into the Google Classroom (code above)
- 2. Before you read:
 - a. Complete the Introduction to Ralph Ellison and Invisible Man assignment
 - b. Review the other materials and assignments posted under the Classwork tab. This will give you an indication of what to look for and record as you read.
- 3. As you read: For each third of the book, complete a **Reading Log and Motif Tracker** (models on next page; there is a digital copy to complete and turn in on Google Classroom)

Due Dates and Expectations:

- Summer work will be due during the first week of school in the fall.
- We will be using your summer work as the foundation for our discussion and work for *Invisible* Man in the fall; you should be prepared by reading the book and completing all assignments to the
 best of your ability.
- Your work will be graded according to the rubric posted on Google Classroom. You will be assessed for quality of thought and thoroughness.
- Your work will also be run through a plagiarism checker. Plagiarized work will receive a 0.

** A NOTE ON MAKING CONNECTIONS: Invisible Man is about racism—systemic racism, violent racism, etc. Making connections to modern, real world events is a great way to make the text relevant (ex: BLM). However, in the past, I have had students try to make personal connections that trivialize the brutality of these experiences for those who have experienced racism and oppression (ex: "segregation is like being left out of a friend group in middle school"). Please be mindful of this as you reflect on the text.

** BE SURE TO ADD TO YOUR MOTIF TRACKER AS YOU READ **
It's much easier to complete that as you go, rather than go back at the end!!

MOTIFS TO CHOOSE FROM:

Preview this list BEFORE you start to read so that you can be on the lookout for these motifs.

Choose ONE from the list to trace throughout the book. (The Motif Tracker is after the Reading Logs.)

- Dreams/awake vs. asleep
- Paper
- Vision vs. blindness (both literal and figurative)
- Objects (choose one):
 - light bulbs
 - old leg shackle
 - briefcase
 - dolls and figurines
