Artists, curators and cultural institutions from all over the world help with your voice to stop the Russian war against Europe and Ukraine! **ASU (Artists Support Ukraine)** is running a number of different programmes and support schemes for Ukrainian artists, from mini-grants to female artists to ideas for solidarity actions. From the first days of the war in Ukraine, Andriy Zoin and Alina Oliynyk, founders of **Bakota Hub** ([Бакота Хаб](#)), started to take in the refugees from the hot spots of our country. Before the 24th of February, they were organizing the festival called "Respublica" and other cultural projects. Today, they continue to work on the premises of the old school in Goraivka village on their own to equip the place for the many refugees who have passed through or stay there still. Call to all theatre and dance people everywhere: a fund in Ukrainian to give micro grants to independent Ukrainian performing artists

To organise ways of supporting the artists that stay on the territory of Ukraine in time of war, the teams of [Ruban Production ITP](#) made a decision to create "Ukrainian Emergency Performing Arts Fund" on the basis of non-profit [CO "Impulse Transformation Platform"](#). We opened two separate accounts in EUR and USD to collect funds. These **donations will allow us to provide emergency microgrant help of 8000 UAH (approximately 250€) to each Ukrainian artist from independent scene staying in Ukraine**, upon their request.

The landing page is created specifically to publish **a quick simple application request-form for Ukrainian artists to obtain microgrants**, as well actual information about donations received (grouped by country) and the amount of the artists that already got support.

2. International associations with members in Ukraine, also raising funds and acting on the ground:

The [Saint Javelin meme](#), which depicts the Virgin Mary holding a Javelin anti-tank missile, has become the symbol of Ukrainian resistance and an unlikely source of funding. Christian Borys, a Canadian journalist turned entrepreneur, turned the meme into a charity brand to help fundraise for the country's reconstruction. "The Russians were unbelievably good at their propaganda in 2014 and 15, and Ukraine couldn't figure out how to counter it – now it's completely flipped around...the overwhelming public image of Ukraine, boosted by memes and local brands, has turned the tide of war", Borys said. Immortalised as a giant mural of an armed saint painted on a Kyiv building, it has been printed on stickers, emblazoned on clothes and posted all over social media networks. The former journalist, who has Ukrainian roots and spent between 2014 and 2018 covering the war in eastern Ukraine, initially just wanted to use the design to sell some \$10 stickers and raise money for charity. Borys plans to turn the project into a social enterprise. All production is planned to take place in Ukraine within the following months in an effort to contribute to rebuilding the country. Their mission statement: We are in business to re-build Ukraine.

Ukrainian charity organisation, *Help Us Help*, has branched into various kinds of assistance and provides protective equipment for journalists covering the war. Founded in 1993, Help Us Help (formerly known as Dopomoha Ukraini – Aid Ukraine) is a federally registered Canadian charitable organization, focused on humanitarian aid and educational projects in Ukraine and in Canada. In the 29 years since being founded, the organization has delivered more than \$25 million dollars in charitable aid to projects and organizations engaged in the areas of humanitarian aid, education, literacy, arts and culture, social work, civil society, and more. In response to the consequences of the 2014 Ukrainian Revolution of Dignity, Euromaidan, Help Us Help expanded its charitable initiatives to include humanitarian support to the victims of the conflict. The organization is committed to raising awareness through education in Canada and in supporting Ukraine's democratic development as the country looks to rebuild a brighter future.

Federation of European Publishers and the Ukrainian Book Institute

A Fund has been established and already printed 600 books for Ukrainian refugee children. The fund aims to print in Europe hundreds of thousands of children's books in Ukrainian to allow children to keep the link with their homeland. The city of Kharkiv, where the main printing works are located, has been heavily bombed, making it impossible to print books in Ukraine. All the money collected will be managed by the UIB, which will choose the titles and coordinate with local relays to print and distribute the books to the children. The FEP is the guarantor of this operation

The MRI is now accepting project applications for temporary relocation to Germany with an earliest start date of September 2022.

"Be careful where you donate. We are on the border. No sign of UNHCR, Care Intl, Save the Children, World Vision.....all totally absent. (IOM was here last night). The work here in Poland is all being done by a loose network of activists, local NGOs and private citizens and they are doing an amazing job. Last night, food was being handed out by a convoy of Sikhs in turbans and a totally whack Scotsman in a kilt and bare knees at 20 degrees. Polish teenagers gave out sandwiches and coffee, German volunteers were driving people. The local fire department was loading buses to take people to a shelter. All being done unofficially, organized by Facebook and text message." "I have not been impressed with the big international organizations. But man, World Central Kitchen <https://wck.org>) has impressed me. They are at every crossing point with hot, nutritious food. (And believe me, after living on packaged snacks for days, people are eager for real food.) WCK, I salute you. You picked a well-defined job and you are doing it excellently."

8. (Arts) Scholarships and other arts opportunities available for Ukrainian refugees:

Opportunities for performing arts people from Ukraine, in Portugal.

The Teatro Nacional São João has set up the project *Ukraine – Free Stage*, a program for Ukrainian artists and cultural professionals who, in the present context of the war in Ukraine and its consequent humanitarian crisis, are currently settling in Portugal.

The program has two fundamental components: 1) integrating actors and other technical and artistic professionals from the theatre industry in the TNSJ's activities, namely its production projects; and 2) awarding grants to artists and professionals from the theatre and other fields so they may develop original projects within this National Theatre's programming framework or carry out workshops at our Educational Centre. The goals of *Ukraine – Free Stage* are to welcome artists and other cultural professionals into a stable theatrical structure and to open a programming space which will hopefully help war refugees to resume their artistic activity in a new setting.

The applicants are required to submit a presentation letter/statement of intent and a short biography or abridged CV, in English, to the following e-mail address: freestage@tnsj.pt.

The Teatro Nacional São João has started the project with a base budget of 50 000 euros, which is being reinforced with the sponsoring support of national companies, themselves *actors* as well on this *Free Stage*.

Scholarships, Accommodation, jobs for Ukrainians in Cardiff, Wales.
