Examples (delete and replace with your own):  I attended a selective research program last summer where I realized that neuroscience is what I want to study.	I love that neuroscience brings together so many different fields (psychology, biology, chemistry, etc.)
I had to drop out of sports and activities at school so we could keep my elderly grandparents at home with us	I was disappointed, but our family has grown a lot closer since then.

### 6. TALENTS & SUPERPOWERS

What do I believe are my gifts? What am I great at?

I can make pretty much anyone laugh	some of my teachers appreciate this, but some really don't. :-P
