- **7.3.** The Executive Committee would like to open discussion of what is essential for fulfilling degree requirements; specifically, credits vs learning outcomes for major and minor requirements. How firm are minimum credit counts in the major and minor?
 - In light of the absence of clear regulations governing decisions related to majors, minors, certificates, minimum/maximum credit requirements, and learning outcomes, the Senate President is requesting that Senators gather feedback from their respective divisions on the issue of double dipping within majors and minors. The objective is to ascertain whether there are any challenges or concerns regarding these matters, including procedures and the 180-credit requirement.
- **7.4.** The Executive Committee would like to open discussion about the difficulty we are experiencing in staffing Faculty Senate-related committee assignments or Faculty Senate positions. We will be issuing the annual <u>faculty service survey</u>.
