
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ABSTRACT (Times New Roman, 10pt, Italic)

The Manuscript should be written in an MS Word file. The abstract should be written both in English and in a single space. The abstract is a summary that includes the background, objectives, methods, results, and conclusion in a clear and concise form. The word count for the abstract should be 200 - 250 words. The abstract should be written in 1 (one) paragraph.

Keywords: Font type Times News Roman, size 10pt, and number of keywords not more than 5 keywords.

The paper itself includes an introduction, Research Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusions, and **References**. For writing the paper's contents, this template should be used to make it easier for the author to arrange the layout of the paper he is writing. The paper will follow the rules in this writing as well as possible so that it becomes uniform for every paper written by the speaker[1]. Manuscripts are written on A4 paper (21 cm x 29.7 cm), with a mirror margin of 30 mm on top, bottom 25 mm, left (inside) 25 mm, and right (outside) 20 mm. The paper's contents are written in Times New Roman font size of 12 pt with 1 space spacing and typed using MS Word. Papers are written between 5-10 pages.[2]

Problem Formulation

For all submitted papers, please still include page numbers and existing headers and footers. Please add the header on the even page according to the paper's title and the author's name. If there is more than one author, add "et. al." to replace the second author's name, and so on.[3]

Authors do not need to change page numbers and footers. This section will be added by the editor when all incoming papers are compiled into one Journal.

2. RESEARCH METHOD

Papers can be written both in Indonesian and English. Writing in the main description uses the Times New Roman font, size 12 pt, justified, 1 space, as in this document. Authors are allowed

to use other types of letters for special purposes, for example to distinguish the source code of a computer program.

The title of a section (heading of the section) is written in Times New Roman Capital 12 pt, bold. Numbering starts with the numbers 1, 2, 3, etc. The paragraph format is justified, and the top and bottom are aligned on one page so that the author can adjust the remaining spacing. Replacement paragraphs are spaced 1 space apart.[4]

Sub chapter

The title of the subsection is written in Times New Roman 12 pt, bold, and written in the sentence case model (capital letters only at the beginning). Subsection titles are written without chapter numbers.

3. RESULT AND DISCUSSION

Tables and figures are placed in the center of the page. Table titles are written above the table, while figure titles are below the figure, both in Times New Roman 12 pt. The letters in the table use Times New Roman 10 pt 1 space. If obtained from other sources, please include sources of tables or figures. Tables are depicted simply to avoid unsightly print results. Each table and figure must be referred to in paragraphs. Tables and figures are placed close to the description that refers to the first time. Generally, Tables and Figures are placed after being mentioned in the description of the paper. Numbering Tables and Figures are sorted from number 1 onwards. An example of a table can be seen in Table 1. Letters for information on Figures should be large and clear enough so that they are easy to read.




Figure 1. Font size 12

REFERENCE

Citations are numbered in the order they appear in the text. Each citation number is enclosed in square brackets, e.g., [1], [2], [3]. If multiple references are cited together, they are included within one set of brackets, separated by commas, e.g., [1], [3], [5]. The citation number corresponds to the full reference in the reference list. References are listed in numerical order, matching the order of citations. Each reference starts with the corresponding citation number in square brackets.

The font used is Times New Roman 12 pt, with a hanging format of 10 mm, as shown in the example below. The text or sentence in the main idea that refers to the reference is marked with the last name of the author.

Example: Since 1995, the concept of unified design provision has been introduced to concrete regulations in America [1], which refers to the paper proposed by Murdock (1992). etc. In addition, the use of d values (for reinforced concrete) and DP (for prestressed concrete) also creates some inconsistencies in the regulations that have been in effect so far [2], etc.

References must be in the form of published materials and/or information easily accessible to the public. The order of writing references is as follows.
