Information	We recommend iReady testing towards the middle/end of this window to give students time and opportunity to receive best first instruction. Initial READ Plans for Kindergarten students who are at or below the <u>cut score</u> and qualify for a READ Plan (please refer to READ Act Identification flowcharts below), need created no later than <u>November 10th</u> (<u>first 90 calendar days of the school year</u>), but can be created sooner. <i>Most importantly-adjust instruction immediately and begin progress monitoring.</i> The READ Act allows for 90 days from the beginning of a kindergartener’s school year to determine a root cause, write a READ plan, and begin to provide instruction. November 10, 2023 is 90 calendar days after the first day of kindergarten. Create a READ Intervention Plan by using all data in collaboration with your school's READ team and the student’s family. Collaborate with families to create the at-home reading plan.
