Failure to observe these guidelines could result in receiving a citation from the City requiring work completed without the appropriate authorization to be redone in accordance with the design guidelines. To receive the appropriate authorization for proposed improvements requires the completion of an Authorization to Proceed (ATP) which can be found at:

Residents in CHAP districts also have an obligation to maintain their properties in a manner consistent with the neighborhood's historical character. This might require periodic restoration work and ensuring the preservation of architectural elements.
