

Frases Útiles 3-4:

Everything on this list is what you are **expected to know** coming into Spanish 3-4. If you aren't familiar with all of this vocabulary, you should print a copy and put it in your binder and study it because you are expected to produce it in class daily (and will lose points if you ask any of the below in English) and ANYTHING on this list could appear at ANY time on a quiz, unit exam, or the final exam. BE PREPARED!!

You may also be assigned a **50-word essay in Spanish** for saying any of the below in English (or for side-conversations in class in English). This essay will be written IN MY ROOM (235) during lunch or Flex the week of the infraction. If you forget, it will **double to 100 words**. This takes effect el 17 **de septiembre**.

I highly suggest you **print this list** out and put it in the **clear front sleeve of your binder** OR as the first sheet in your vocab section! Please also make these **flashcards** for next class.

Questions for class:

***Tengo una pregunta.** I have a question.

***¿Cómo se dice...?** How do you say...?

***¿Cómo se diría...?** How would you say...

***¿Qué significa...?** What does...mean?

***¿Me permite ir al baño/a mi casillero/armario?** Can I go to the bathroom/my locker (literally: "Permit me to go...")

***¿Puedo ir al baño?** Can I go to the bathroom?

***¿Me permite hablar en inglés?** Can I speak in English?

***¿Me permite sacarle punta a mi lápiz?** Can I sharpen my pencil?

***¿Me prestas...(un lápiz, tu libro, etc.)?** Can you lend me...(a pencil, your book, etc.)?

Day/date/time:

***¿Cuál es la fecha?** What's the date?

¿Qué día es hoy? What day is it?

¿Qué hora es? What time is it?

¿Cuándo termina la clase? When does class end?

¿Cuándo es...? When is...(the exam, lunch, etc.)

Son las...It's ___o'clock ("Es la..." for any time in the one o'clock hour).

A las...at___o'clock ("A la..." for any event in the one o'clock hour).

Hoy es el__(fecha)___**de**__(mes)___**del**__(año)__. Today is the __(date)___of (month)—of (year).

Tarea/Homework:

Se me olvidó la tarea. I forgot the homework.

***¿Hay tarea?** Is there homework?

¿Cuál es la tarea? What is the homework?

No tengo la tarea. I don't have the homework.

No hice la tarea. I didn't do the homework.

No la tengo. I don't have it. ("la" refers to "it," or **la** tarea, in this case).

No la hice. I didn't do it.

¿Cuándo se entrega...? When do you turn in...?:

¿Cómo se escribe..? Cómo se deletrea...? How do you spell...?

Ausencias/Absences:

Falté ayer. I was absent yesterday.

Falté anteayer. I was absent the day before yesterday.

No estuve en clase ayer. I wasn't in class yesterday.

No estuve en clase anteayer. I wasn't in class the day before yesterday.

Phrases you hear in class: you should at least be able to UNDERSTAND the following very soon...

memorize something: aprender _____ de memoria

write a report: escribir un informe

give a speech/lecture: dar un discurso

take notes: tomar apuntes

repeat the words: repetir las palabras

get good grades: sacar buenas notas

get bad grades: sacar malas notas

Pass the class: aprobar la clase

Go to class: asistir a la clase

Fail the class: suspender la clase

Do a project: hacer un proyecto

Study for an exam: estudiar para un examen

I'm sorry: Lo siento

I need your signature: Necesito su firma

Let's take out the materials: Hay que sacar los materiales

I would like to introduce you to...Me gustaría presentarle (o presentarte) a...

It's a pleasure: Mucho gusto

midnight: la medianoche

noon: el mediodía
