

# Golf Genius Tournament Management Guide: Multi-Round Multi-Format Tournaments

A Step-by-step Guide and Checklist

**Note:** This guide can be printed or viewed on your computer. While printing the guide may be easier for viewing, we also suggest keeping the guide readily available on the computer because there are many links below to more articles that will help you along the process.

Certain types of events in golf play multiple formats over multiple rounds. We call these Linked Tournaments because you will create a different tournament for every format, then link them together for an aggregate score.

The leaderboard above shows the final results for a 36-hole linked tournament using two-person teams. This linked tournament plays 9 holes of Alternate Shot, Scramble, Four Ball, and Both Balls.

These linked tournaments are typically Stroke Play or Stableford tournaments. For instructions on creating a match play Ryder Cup tournament, <u>Click Here</u>.

### 1. Create the Event

Go to the Customer Center > Leagues & Events > Create New League/Event. Create the event. Skip the wizard since you will follow this guide.

### 2. Add Players

Use any of the following methods to add players to the event:

- Import from Master Roster or other Leagues/Events If you already have a Master Roster created, you can go through and select each person who will be playing in the event. Or you can select players from past events/leagues. To do this, go to Golfers > Import Golfers from Master Roster.
- <u>Event Registration</u> Your golfers can register for the event online, and the player roster will populate as they register.
- Add Players from GHIN: If you are a GHIN club, you can add players from your GHIN
  roster or any GHIN roster in the national database. Go to Golfers > Import Golfers from
  Master Roster / GHIN.
- Manually Add Players: Enter the players and their info one-by-one. Go to Golfers > Manually Add Players to Roster.
- <u>Upload a Spreadsheet</u> If you have the player roster on a spreadsheet, you can quickly upload it by going to Golfers > Upload Roster from Spreadsheet

Create a column for first name, last name, and Handicap Index. If the player's GHIN/GolfNet IDs are in the spreadsheet, then the Handicap Index will be retrieved for you.

Some other recommended fields include:

• **Tee:** This field is recommended if multiple tees are used in the event. It will make the process of setting up tees quicker later on in this guide.


- Additional <u>Custom Fields</u>: Upload additional custom fields for your convenience (e.g., Bag Storage #, Shirt Size, Phone). These custom fields will be stored in the player roster. They can also be displayed on the tee sheet next to players' names.
- **Email:** This helps with communicating with the players. You can send mass emails to all or some of the players with ease (e.g., rain delay, sponsor email).
- **Team:** Having a custom field that identifies the teams will save you time later in the setup process.

When the spreadsheet is ready, go to Golfers > Upload Roster from Spreadsheet > Choose File. Import the file, and click "Upload".

Match your columns to our attributes (Some may be matched automatically) by clicking on your column, clicking our attribute, then clicking "Match". Any unmatched columns will be created as custom fields.

### 3. Add Rounds

Go to Calendar > Add Rounds. Select the date of the rounds.




If you are playing multiple rounds on the same day, click the date twice. You will then be asked to confirm that you want a second round added on that date.

Once the round dates are highlighted, click "Save".

### 4. Create Teams:

### To create teams:


- A. Go to Event > Event Profile > General Settings. Select "This event uses Teams/Groups.
- B. Go to Golfers > Event Divisions/Flights/Teams > Manage Team Lists.



Enter a name for the list of teams, and set the team size. Select the method to create the teams. For more details on all of the methods, <u>Click Here</u>. Click "Next" and the teams will be generated.

### 5. Create Tournaments

Create a tournament for each format. Go to Rounds > Round 1 > Tournaments. Set up the tournament(s) being played in the first round. Then, go to the next round and set up the tournament(s) for that round. If there are different formats for each 9, then create two tournaments within each round.



In the screenshot above, we are setting up an alternate shot tournament for the back 9.




Within that round, we have a scramble tournament for the front 9, and an alternate shot tournament set up on the back 9. (Look at the screenshot above.)

In order to link all these tournaments together, the format and competition in the tournament setup must be the same.

### 6. Link the Tournaments

Go to Event > Multi-Round Tournaments > Link Existing Tournament into Aggregate Tournament.



Name the linked tournament (e.g., Overall, Aggregate, etc). Select the tournaments that need to be linked, and enter the abbreviation (to display on the leaderboard). Click "Save".


After navigating to the Linked Tournament setup page, you will see two tabs that you will need to take the following actions on:

- A. **Linked Tournaments:** For the linked tournament tab, take the following action:
  - a. Name the overall Linked Tournament.
  - b. Select the tournaments to be linked, and enter tournament abbreviations (if necessary). The abbreviations will be used on the leaderboard column headers to identify the format for each round. Note: If there is a tournament that disappears when you select another tournament, that means the two tournaments are not compatible. Like stated above, there are certain parameters that need to be the same in order to link.


Below is an example of a 36-hole Linked Tournament where scramble is played on the first round and alternate shot is played on the second round.


- B. Advanced Settings: Go to the "Advanced Settings" tab, and select the following:
  - a. **Linking Method:** Select "Add Results of the Selected Tournaments" (as shown below).




 Tie-Breaking Tournament: (Note: This option is only available by request or on a case-by-case basis. Please reach out to our support team with questions.)
 Choose a Tournament for Tie-Breaking. Ties can be broken in a linked tournament by using the higher-ranked player/team on a tournament leaderboard. Choose the round and tournament leaderboard to be used for tie-breaking. Only tournaments linked to this tournament are available to be selected.



c. **Display Options:** Manage how you would like the results of the leaderboard displayed. For more details, review the <u>Advanced Display Option</u> article.



d. Payout: In the "Advanced Settings" tab, enter the points and purse (if any) for the overall linked tournament.



e. **Season Points:** If you are <u>managing season points</u> for the season, you can also select the season points category and allocation table to be used for the linked tournament being set up.



Save the linked tournament by clicking "Save." The linked tournament will then be set up. For a step-by-step tutorial on setting up a multi-round multi-format tournament, <u>Click Here</u>.

### 7. Create Pairings for Round 1:

Go to the Rounds for Round 1 > Create New Pairings.

Step 1: Automatic or Manual?


Create pairings using one of the following options:

- **Automatic Scheduling** Randomly create pairings by ABCD, ABAB, or by player Handicap Index (lowest four handicapped players paired together as a pairing group, then the next lowest four will be paired, and so on.)
- Manual Pairings Define the pairings yourself. Select the players in the first pairing group, and click "Create Pairing". Repeat this step until all pairing groups are created.
- Create Pairings Using Custom Field If you have uploaded a spreadsheet of players
  with the "Pairing Group" custom field, you can create pairings by selecting the custom
  field and clicking "Next".
- Create Pairings by Entry Number Players are assigned to pairing groups in the order
  in which they are added to the system. For instance, if you uploaded a spreadsheet of
  players, the first four players listed in the spreadsheet will be a foursome, and so on. If
  you added players manually, then the first four players added will be together, then the
  next four, and so on.

After selecting the method, click "Next", then "Continue". Your pairings will then be generated.


### 8. Set Course/Tee, Starting Times, and Shotguns:

Once the pairings are created, you will be directed to the "Edit Existing Pairings" page




Complete the following steps on this page:

A. Set Course/Tee: Click Set Course & Tee > Select All Players.



Select the tee that the players will be using. If multiple tees are being used, you can use the <u>default tees</u> (if set up) or individually select the players above (they will highlight/un-highlight in orange) to place them on different tees. After the tees are set, click "Go". <u>Click Here</u> for more details on setting the Course & Tee.

B. Set Tee Time/Shotgun: If you have a shotgun start, click on "Set Shotgun", "Select All".



Set the starting time. Make sure all 18 holes have the correct number of pairing groups in them. For details on setting a shotgun start, <u>Click Here</u>.

If setting tee times instead, go to Set Tee Time > Select All. Then select the first time, interval, and starting hole. For details on setting tee times, <u>Click Here</u>.

### 9. Check Playing Handicaps with Handicap Analysis

Go to Rounds > <u>Handicap Analysis</u> to ensure the Playing Handicaps are being computed as expected.

### 10. Check Setup with Pre-Play Audit

Go to Rounds > Pre-Play Audit to make sure there are no "warning flags" in your setup.

### 11. Preview Leaderboard with Random Scores

Go to Rounds > Enter Scores > Random Scores > <u>Test Leaderboard</u>. If the leaderboard displays as expected, go back to "Enter Scores" and clear the random scores.

### 12. Print Material

Go to Rounds > Report Center to access your printed material. Frequently used printed material includes:

- Scorecards
- Cart Signs
- Scoreboards
- Tee Sheets

To access and print reports created by others in the user community, select "Discover Reports" and use the search or filter tools to find your desired reports.

13. Enable Mobile Score Entry, if necessary

If you are using live scoring, turn the toggle switch ON under the Rounds Menu.

### 14. Move round to In Progress

Go to the Rounds Menu and click "In Progress". The leaderboard will now be live.

### 15. Enter Scores


Go to Rounds > Enter Scores. Click on a pairing group to enter gross hole-by-hole scores. (Note: If scores are being entered via mobile app, then skip this step.)

### 16. Complete Round:

Once all scores are entered, go to the Rounds Menu, move the round status to "Completed", and turn mobile score entry "OFF" (if necessary). Then, go to Rounds > Display Leaderboard. Points and purse (if set up) will then be awarded.

### 17. Creating Pairings for Next Round:

Go to Rounds > Round 2 > Create New Pairings.



In most multi-round tournaments, subsequent rounds are <u>paired by using previous round</u> <u>results</u>. In the setup above, we are using the Round 1 scores from an individual stroke play tournament. Leaders will be organized in the last pairings. Teams in last place will be organized in the first pairings. All the teams will be included in the Round 2 pairings.

<u>Click Here</u> for details on pairing by previous results. If using your own method for creating round 2 pairings, create <u>Manual Pairings</u> rather than pairings by previous results.

### 18. Finish the Event:

Go back to Steps 7 thru 16 to complete Round 2.

## **Printed Material Notes:**

### Scorecards:

When printing scorecards for any rounds following the first round, you can include the current player/team score on the scorecard. <u>Click Here</u> for instructions.

### Scoreboards:

You can access many scoreboard templates, created with the <u>Report Composer</u> by others in the user community, by going to Rounds > Report Center > Discover Reports. Filter by Category (Scoreboards).

Most scoreboards in "Discover Reports" have a column for every round. The column header is typically "Round 1", "Round 2", "Total", etc (like the scoreboard above). You can choose to keep those column headers or replace them with the format (e.g., Four Ball, Alt Shot, Scramble, etc). To do this, select the option to design the column header (as shown below) and change the column header names.
